~ 2016 Men's Retreat ~



“Unity Letter”

Many people today have a misconception of what unity really means, especially those in the body of Christ. The reason such a misconception exists is because many Christians in various ministries are trying to take a worldly or secular concept of unity and trying to apply it to spiritual principles. This approach can cripple the church and causes her to operate in a false concept of unity. The solution to this problem is that the church must understand that there is a difference between just mere "unity" and that which the church must embrace called "spiritual unity."

Webster defines unity as, "the quality or state of being made one." The focus here is on oneness. Webster's definition is correct. However, to make the concept of oneness applicable to Christians or the body of Christ in the church presents a problem. The reason being, oneness according to Webster can be accomplished outwardly. This is not to say that outward unity is not important. There are many good qualities that can grow out of outward unity, such as: cooperation, communication, joy, encouragement, obedience, and many other positive actions. However, one must keep in mind that the ultimate focus should be on inward unity. Outward unity should never be the ultimate goal of the Christian in the body of Christ. The word of God never seeks to bring about change outwardly first. The reason is because outward change can never give birth or rise to inward change.

If the body of Christ is going to preserve the "unity of the spirit," we must possess all the necessary graces such as; humility, meekness, longsuffering, forbearance, and peace. Christians should be able to walk in unity considering the fact that we are children in the same family, loving and serving the same Father. Spiritual unity is not something that we as Christians must manufacture. Instead it is something we already have in Christ. Therefore, we must protect and maintain it and it is everyone's responsibility.





As most of the long-time members know, I lost my first husband (Africa and Rashee's dad) to cancer in 1994. God blessed us numerous times during this period.


During November of that year, we were back and forth to Macon for chemo, surgery, shots, you name it. My mother-in-law had come during this period to help so that I could continue to work. My husband had not worked regularly since Mid-August of that year.

Well, we were so busy; we didn't realize that Thanksgiving had crept up on us. Something came on television to remind us that it was the Wednesday evening before Thanksgiving. Sort of at the same time, we realized we hadn't been to the grocery store in a while. Each day after I got off work, we would run to Macon for a visit and then rush back. We would just pick up dinner on the way. I looked in the freezer and there was nothing to cook but we were both too tired to go back out.

Not ten minutes later, there was a knock at the door. A friend of my husband's stood there with a box of groceries, a turkey, and a smile. He worked at the railroad and they were giving away boxes of food. He normally didn't help out with distribution, but he said he told them he had to make sure we got one. Just after he left, there was another knock. Here stood Union Grove Mission with another box of groceries. God truly came through for us on this day. Those groceries lasted us quite a while.

You may not know what your fellow members are going through, but God does. He showed up right on time!






