





~ SEVEN STEPS TO SPIRITUAL CLEANSING ~

A deep spiritual cleansing took place for The Women Ministry Consecration Service on June 24, 2017. The women were asked to look at "ME" and to take an individual inventory of themselves and to let the Word of God and Jesus wash them and cleanse them for the journey.

All those emotions and things that were not of God, such as anger, hatred, bitterness, unforgiveness, jealousy and revenge, we got rid of them by taking them to the cross. Different colored scarves were used to take our emotions and sins to the cross as the seven steps to spiritual cleansing were taught.

The white scarf---represented Jesus and the white scarf was placed on the cross. Jesus paid the price for all our sins and had it not been for God sending His Son to the cross, there would be no remission of sins. Because of the blood we are cleansed and made whole.

Hebrews 12:1-2 (NCV) We are surrounded by a great cloud of people whose lives tells us what faith means. So, let us run the race that is before us and never give up. We should remove from our lives anything that would get in the way and the sin that so easily holds us back. Let us look only to Jesus, the One who began our faith and who makes it perfect. He suffered death on the cross. But He accepted the shame as if it were nothing because of the joy that God put before Him. And now He is sitting at the right side of God's throne.

The Seven Steps to Spiritual Cleansing are:

Step #1: CLEANSE THE HEART-GET SPIRITUALLY HEALTHY

The red scarf--- represented anger and the red scarf was placed on the cross to get rid of anger.

Ephesians 4:26 (NCV) When you are angry, do not sin, and be sure to stop being angry before the end of the day.

Step #2: CLEAN OUT THE MOUTH - DEEP CLEAN INSIDE AND OUTSIDE

The black scarf---represented verbal pollution - nasty attitudes and the black scarf was placed on the cross to cleanse verbal communications and nasty attitudes.

Luke 6:45 (NCV) Good people bring good things out of the good they stored in their hearts. But evil people bring evil things out of the evil they stored in their hearts. People speak the things that are in their hearts.

Matt. 15:18 (NCV) But what people say from their mouths comes from the way they think; these are the things that make people unclean.

Step #3: RENEW YOUR MIND - TAKE OUT THE GARBAGE

The gray scarf---represented the mind and all the things going on in the mind and the gray scarf was placed on the cross to cleanse the mind of garbage.

II Corinthians 10:5 (NCV) Every proud thing that raises itself against the knowledge of God, we capture every thought and make it give up and obey Christ.

Philip. 2:5 (KJV) Let this mind be in you, which was also in Christ Jesus.

Step #4: REPENT FROM HIDDEN SIN (SECRET SIN) – CLEAN OUT YOUR SPIRITUAL CLOSETS

The blue scarf--represented depression and the blue scarf was placed on the cross to get rid of depression and emotional problems.

Psalm 19:12-13 (NCV) People cannot see their own mistakes. Forgive me for my secret sins. Keep me from the sins of pride; don't let them rule me. Then I can be pure and innocent of the greatest of sins.

Step #5: RELEASE UNFORGIVENESS AND BITTERNESS – GET RID OF OLD BAGGAGE

The green scarf represented bitterness and unforgiveness and the green scarf was placed on the cross to get rid of old baggage.

Ephesians 4:31-32 (NCV) Do not be bitter or angry or mad. Never shout angrily or say things to hurt others. Never do anything evil. Be kind and loving to each other, and forgive each other just as God forgave you in Christ.

Step #6: INVOLVE JESUS IN YOUR DAILY LIFE

The yellow scarf represented busyness and the yellow scarf was placed on the cross to remember to always acknowledge Jesus in all we do.

Proverbs 3:5-6 (NCV) Trust in the Lord with all your heart, and don't depend on your own understanding. Remember the Lord in all you do, and He will give you your success.

Step #7: LEARN TO LAUGH AT YOURSELF AND AT LIFE – LIVE, LOVE, LAUGH

The orange scarf represented restoration of joy and happiness and the orange scarf was placed on the cross to restore happiness and joy.

Psalm 126: 2-3 (NCV) Then we were filled with laughter, and we sang happy songs. Then the other nations said, the Lord has done great things for them. The Lord has done great things for us, and we are very glad.

The multi-colored scarf represented all sins, trials and persecutions, headaches and heartaches, sickness and pain, struggles, grief and sorrows, afflictions and diseases, financial problems, wayward children and all the cares of the world and the multi-colored scarf was placed on the cross.

The last scarf was another red scarf that represented the blood of Jesus that washed away all of our sins. Everything that was placed on the cross was covered by this red scarf, the blood of Jesus.

Using the different colored scarves as the Lord gave them to me, was a way to taking our sins and all of our emotions to the cross to Jesus. We cannot cleanse ourselves but, the Word of God and Jesus' sacrificial body and blood can.

I John 1:9 (NCV) But if we confess our sins, He will forgive our sins, because we can trust God to do what is right. He will cleanse us from all the wrongs we have done.

Women, the world needs women to make a difference in our society and the only way change is going to come in our homes, churches, schools and communities, we women have to change within first.

concern by offering to come and teach a mentoring and/or counseling class. It was truly a blessing and an eye-opening experience of the prison life.







What Happened??????????


What happened to the first half of the year? What happened to my budget? What happened to summer vacation? Yes, six months have passed, but that means we still have six months to get on track with our goals. Just like in any sport, whatever you messed up in the first half can be fixed in the second. Let's try to do better for the next six months. Let's take each thing one at a time:

- 1. What happened to the first half of the year? It ticked away one day at a time. Do you remember the old saying, time moves faster when you get older? It actually doesn't, we're just so busy, and we don't notice the time. Check out **Ephesians 5:15-17.**
- 2. What happened to my budget? We may have ignored a few Biblical principles this year. Like Proverbs 3:9 Honor the Lord with your wealth and with the firstfruits of all your produce; I Corinthians 4:2 Moreover, it is required of stewards that they be found trustworthy and Proverbs 22:7 The rich rule over the poor and the borrower is the slave of the lender. First, consider whether we failed to pay our tithes, manage our finances well, and got into further debt. If we are guilty, we need to repent and ask God for help in these areas. If we are not guilty of any of the above, we still need to ask God for guidance. Remember, God is a God of second chances. We can turn things around and make this an awesome year. If each year you find yourself in the same financial situation, don't be too proud to ask for help.
- 3. What happened to summer vacation? I blame the school system for this one. With the added breaks (fall, winter, spring), school is starting earlier and earlier. You only have a short window between school ending and when it starts back. If your job vacation doesn't coincide, you have a big problem. Houston County schools begin August 2 with those of you teaching going back July 26th. It's already time for back to school shopping. Keep in mind that it will still be hot so you can hit the late summer clearance sales and save some money. If you can get yourself one of the Georgia magazines, or check on line, you will see loads of fun things to do in Georgia. If you are able to go away for the weekend, that would be great. There are fun things you can do as a day trip, i.e. Six Flags, White Water, Wild Adventures, etc. Sometimes, a small pool and a water hose will suffice. Remember, if you can't pay for it, vacationing isn't worth it. When I say pay for it, I mean no charging! Remember! If you can't get a greater return for the interest you will be paying, it is not wise to charge. Vacations and food fall into this category.



Maintaining Godly Boundaries Even Under Pressure Deacon Jimmy Oglesby

When you're faced with an imminent threat, your body releases adrenaline. Your heart beats faster. Your muscles tense, and all your senses switch to "Go." But what happens when your spiritual well-being is under attack? Do you stand strong in your desire to do God's will...or run for the hills? The path of faith is tough traveling. Fighting to hold on to God's purposes under adverse conditions is inconvenient, impractical, and thoroughly unpredictable. Standing firm under pressure reveals our true convictions about God, about everything.



I once read a quote, "A lot of crimes are not sins, and a lot of sins are not crimes." Our studies indicate that to be a true statement. In *Being God's Man by Standing Firm Under Pressure* we've examined one man—

named Daniel—and his band of brothers who demonstrated how not to compromise under pressure. They didn't let misfortune, temptation, manipulation, intimidation, or even death shake their faith into compromise. Instead, they faced each new challenging circumstance with courage and trust. As God's man, you can, too.

In our first session, we focused on Chapter 1: Not Budging (Staying Loyal to God by Setting and Maintaining Boundaries). Daniel and his three friends are divinely delivered from a confrontation with

the Babylonian government and Nebuchadnezzar its king. Though Hebrews, these men were willing to be called by Babylonian names, attend Babylonian schools, and even work for a Babylonian government, yet they were not willing to eat the food served at the king's table. God granted these men favor in the eyes of their foreign superiors, and they were allowed to eat vegetables, rather than the food set aside for them by their king. Because of their faithfulness, God gave these men an extra measure of wisdom, greatly impressing King Nebuchadnezzar, who gave them positions of influence and responsibility in his kingdom. Daniel 1 reveals what set Daniel apart from the rest of his Jewish peers and brought him to a position of prominence and power in King Nebuchadnezzar's administration.

Session 2 focused on Chapter 2: Not Panicking (Maintaining Strong Convictions and Confidence in Times of Chaos). Once again God delivered Daniel and his three friends. King Nebuchadnezzar had a dream he could not understand; neither could his counselors and wise men reveal or interpret the dream. In anger, the king commanded the execution of all the wise men of the land, including Daniel and his friends. In the providence of God, Daniel learned of the king's dilemma and was able to reveal to the king his dream and its meaning, sparing his own life and the lives of the other Babylonian wise men.

Session 3 focused on Chapter 3: Not On Board (Experiencing Our Own Deliverances Through Devotion to God). Nebuchadnezzar created a great golden image, before which the people of all nations were to bow in worship. Daniel's three friends refused to bow down. Again in anger, Nebuchadnezzar threatened them with death if they did not obey his decree. Refusing to obey, they were thrown into a fiery furnace. God was present with them there and preserved them from death, injury, and even the smell of fire. The king was so impressed he issued a decree guaranteeing the Jews freedom to worship their God without hindrance.

Session 4 focused on Chapter 4: Not Pulling Punches (Speaking What People Need to Hear in the Moment). It spoke of King Nebuchadnezzar's deliverance. He is delivered from his pride and oppression when, for a period, his sanity and kingdom are removed from him, and he must live like a beast of the field. From his own testimony, it appears he came to genuine repentance and saving faith as a result of God's working in his life.

Session 5 focused on Chapter 5: Not Being Afraid to Do the Hard Things (Being Obedient in Tough Circumstances). We witnessed King Belshazzar's (the son of King Nebuchadnezzar) condemnation in contrast to his dad's conversion in chapter 4. Because of his rejection of the truth, and his blasphemy against the God of Israel, only one day in the life of Belshazzar is recorded in Scripture, only to announce his condemnation and death. He wouldn't learn from his daddy's mistakes!

Session 6, we've started to explore Chapter 6: Not Being Intimidated (Living for an Audience of One). Daniel's life is in danger, and he will experience God's deliverance. This righteous man is convicted of a crime, which is not a sin. Daniel purposefully committed this crime because he did not wish to commit a sin, which was not a crime. Daniel's deliverance from the lion's den, one of the most popular and well-known Bible stories, is not the first great deliverance in the Book of Daniel, but it is the best loved. It is in this chapter what we're able to identify what sustained Daniel over the many years of his ministry and enabled him to survive the crises of his life. While Daniel deservedly commands center stage in this chapter, much can be learned from King Darius and even Daniel's peers, who seek to arrange his downfall and destruction. Once again in the Book of Daniel, we are reminded that God is able to deliver His people, even in a distant land.

As we're continuing our studies, feel free to join us on the 2^{nd} and 4^{th} Monday from 6:30 - 8:00 p.m. at the Vision Center as we continue to encourage one another.




