"What is Your Jonah?"

Monday Night Bible Study has been so rewarding for the women of Union Grove. We started out this quarter reading "Stuck in a Storm and Missing Your Calm" by Pastor Lorenzo L. Heard, Sr. Pastor of Greater Second Mt. Olive Missionary Baptist Church in Albany, GA. Although Pastor Heard wrote his book and distributed copies to many of our members some years back, Deaconess Dorothy Jackson heard the Lord say, "Read it again and for some a first time." So we agreed to begin this journey with the Lord at the helm of our ship and with each other.

Unfolding the pages of this magnificent testimony speaks to the many challenges that we face on a daily basis as God's trusted people. What in the world could have overtaken your spiritual sense, your intellectual drive, or your emotional confidence for you to walk away from your creator, God?

So, as we sat, we discovered that our Jonah's might be too much of this and too little of that, needing a sabbatical, witchcraft (rebellion), incompetence, suicidal tendencies, isolation, defilement and hurt; just to name a few of the giants that we face. Yes, we discovered that the only perfect human was Jesus Christ from Nazareth and even he withstood an old rugged cross to set the captives free, to apply salve to the bruised of heart and good news to the poor. We know that he asked the question, "Is there another way to save these folks?" But in all of his agony and passion, he fulfilled his assignment for us. We have life because of him. He completed us. Although, we are not finished with the book, we are encouraged to know that no matter the tasks set before us, we are expected to win. So sisters, continue to run this race to see just what the end is going to be. I bless you.

Don't Look Now!

Don't look now, but its October already. Didn't we just have Easter? Time must be on fast forward. Either that or I'm getting old. Nevertheless, it's time to make some preparations.

As I am sure you have heard, Equifax had a big data breach. What does that mean for you? Well, Equifax is one of the three credit reporting, i.e. credit reports and FICA scores. That means someone may already have our financial information. We have three options:

- 1. Go to <u>equifaxsecurity2017.com</u> and sign up for free monitoring service for a year. This will let you know if anyone is trying to use your credit, change your address, or use your SSN for medical purposes. It is free; however, you may be giving up your right to sue. When you accept, you agree to arbitration if there are any problems.
- 2. Purchase a separate monitoring service. You retain your rights just in case something goes terribly wrong. There are several companies out there. I just happen to represent one that not only monitors, but is proactive in investigating and helping you clean up any messes that have been made to your credit by fraud. Just ask me.
- 3. Do nothing. There is a chance you won't be affected. If your credit is already bad, no one will want to use it. However, they may still be able to use your information to get medical services.
- 4. In addition to the above, be careful of e-mails or letters you get in the mail that may seem like they are from Equifax. The fraudsters are already out there. We can't put our heads in the sand. Be proactive in protecting yourself and your family.


The Healthcare Marketplace open season is right around the corner. It is shorter this year. It runs from November 1 thru December 15. According to the paper, because congress was unable to pass a new healthcare bill and is so far unwilling to work to fix the current system, premiums will be going up for those counties that still have an insurer in the market place. Remember, if you can't prove you are covered by some form of insurance, you will be fined. The fine goes up each year. According to Google: The penalty is calculated in one of two ways: either as a percentage of your total household adjusted gross income or a flat rate, whichever is greater. For tax year 2017, the penalty is 2.5% of your total household adjusted gross income, or \$695.00 per adult and \$347.50 per child, up to a maximum of \$2,085.00.

I forgot to mention last month that September was Insurance Awareness Month. When was the last time you checked your life, auto, homeowners insurance to see if they still fit your families need?. When was the last time you updated your beneficiary?

VOTE COUNTS

** GET OUT AND VOTE! **



Barack Obama - Need I say more in emphasizing the importance of voting? Many of us — more than 50 million citizens in this country are eligible to vote, but do not bother to register. Every citizen of the U. S. over the age of 17 1/2 is eligible to register and vote. The Voting Rights Act is a historic civil rights law that is meant to ensure that the right to vote is not denied on account of race or color. People died in previous years so that we can vote for those who will represent us.

Many people vote because they are for or against an issue or candidate. For others, voter registration is about ensuring high voter turnout in the community, which results in greater access to elected officials and more of a say in decisions affecting the community. Neighborhoods and communities that vote get more attention from candidates and office holders. They are less likely to visit and listen to communities that don't participate in elections.

Because our kids and youth, people under 18 can't vote; our children or youth depend on us to represent their voices, too! When we vote, we are looking out for our kids by voting for their future as well as ours.

Those voting in Warner Robins should remember the following dates:

- The General Election will be held on November 7, 2017.
- **Runoff** (if required) will be held on December 5, 2017.
- <u>The last day to register</u> to be able to vote in this election is October 10, 2017. You may register to vote at City Hall when you're 17 1/2. Union Grove is fortunate in having our very own Deacon Jerome Stephens, a big advocate in registering people to vote.
- <u>Absentee or early voting</u> will be held October 16 through November 2, 2017 (beginning 8:00 a.m.) through November 3rd at City Hall/ Council Pre-Chamber

Polls will be open On Election Day (November 7, 2017) from 7:00 a.m. - 7:00 p.m. at the following locations:


