













¹⁸Now the birth of Jesus Christ was as follows: After His mother Mary was betrothed to Joseph, before they came together, she was found with child of the Holy Spirit. ¹⁹Then Joseph her husband, being a just man, and not wanting to make her a public example, was minded to put her away secretly. ²⁰But while he thought about these things, behold, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream, saying, "Joseph, son of David, do not be afraid to take to you Mary your wife, for that which is conceived in her is of the Holy Spirit.

In today's society, the Protection Industry has become big business. It seems everywhere you turn, there's some new protection device, scheme or legislation happening. There's a constant stream of legislation seeking to regulate just about every dimension of our lives. In an attempt to avoid lawsuits, manufacturers are adding all kinds of new safety features to their products. From medicine bottles with child-proof tops, trigger guards, seat belts, airbags, and crumple zones. You can't ride a bike without a helmet, or even smoke in public facilities anymore. We're security and protection conscious to the point of we've got security cameras on our roofs to having security patrols walking our parking lots. But while security systems and bars on the windows may deter a burglar or invader, there's a far more important level of protection many of us have neglected. In Matthew 1, there's a statement made about Joseph that stands out as something every man, and in particular, every husband, needs to take serious thought toward. Joseph her husband, being a just man, and not wanting to make her a public example, was minded to put her away secretly." Let's try to get in to Joseph's head & heart for a moment; what might he be thinking and feeling when he discovered Mary was pregnant? First off – he knew the child wasn't his because as v. 18 says, they'd not come together in that way yet. Second – Mary's pregnancy was a shocker because Mary didn't seem like that kind of a woman, and Joseph had no idea she was interested in another man. Third – all his hopes and expectations about the glorious day of his wedding and then life together with Mary were foiled by what has happened! You see, Joseph couldn't wed Mary. It wasn't just that he felt betrayed and wanted nothing to do with her - no, it was far more serious than that. The child Mary bore was not his, and as much as he may have liked to forgive and overlook the infidelity in his deep love for her, the fact the child was not his was an absolute deal-breaker! As a Jew, and as a member of the tribe of Judah, Joseph's family name was tied to a plot of land given to him by God! His firstborn son would be the one to whom the land and family name would be given. Mary's son, was not his son, and could not fill the role that would be assigned to him. But even more importantly, Joseph was in the royal line of David and his son would carry on that line in promise of the coming Messiah! When we read the story of the nativity we often think about how hard it must have been for young Mary to have to bear the stigma of her pregnancy. Let's not forget how hard it was for Joseph. Indeed, he was caught in one of the hardest spots any man has ever faced. On one had was his deep & devoted love for Mary, but on the other was his sense of responsibility to generations of his ancestors and descendants – and to the prophetic plans & purposes of God. Not to mention his pride and ego as a man! What was he to do? What would YOU have done? What guided him was his sense of justice. As v. 19 says, he was a just, a righteous man. Really, he was a truly godly man! We can say that with all confidence because of what it says he did. We find that Joseph had a purpose, and he allowed his PURPOSE to be greater than his EGO. Joseph her husband, being a just man, and not wanting to make her a public example, was minded to put her away secretly." Joseph wasn't all cold, trying to figure a way to get even for what he perceived Mary had done. He was a passionate man, concerned with doing the right thing. Not just as his emotions demanded, but with an eye to what God would have him do. His sense of justice was shaped by a healthy dose of mercy – and in this he shows the character of the Lord. Joseph was well within his rights to distance himself from Mary. After all, it wouldn't be long before her pregnancy would become the talk of the small village of Nazareth where they lived. If he didn't take a public stand, denouncing her and breaking it off in an open way, then there would always be suspicion attached to him as well. His divorce of her would leave all kinds of questions in people's minds about his own credibility. But Joseph knew if he took the route of exposing her publicly, it would doom her and her child to a terrible fate. So while the safest course for Joseph would be public exposure of Mary's pregnancy, he could not do it because of the life and fate it would doom her to. He would rather leave her to the Lord's hand than to man's. He was a just yet merciful man. As hurt as he had to have been at her seeming disloyalty to him, he thought only of what was best in the situation for her. If Joseph had been "just a man" he would have looked out only for his own interests, and Mary be damned! But Joseph wasn't just a man, he was a just man, a godly man – a man who understood that it was his duty to protect his wife, even as he moved to end their engagement.

DON'T GET LEFT BEHIND!

This year should be a year of prosperity for all of us. The Trump tax cuts are in effect for 2018 and most of us should have seen a little extra in Sister Wanda Verrett our paychecks. As I stated last month, don't blow it. Whatever amount extra you received can set you up for a better year. Most of the regulation roll backs are to benefit the wealthy; however, we might as well take advantage of them.

The stock market is up so if you are not already investing, get into the market. It's not just for the rich. If you are saving money at the bank or credit union you could be investing in the market and getting a better return on your money. **Don't get left behind.** Make this your most prosperous year. If you need assistance, call me.

It's still tax time. Some of you have already filed and are waiting on refunds. That means car lots, furniture stores, and appliance dealers are having massive sales and the scammers are ready to compete for that money. What are you going to do with that lump of cash? For most of us, what we say when we file is completely different from what we actually end up doing. To insure you get done what you intend, write down the things you really need and intend to cover. This way when that check comes in you can pull out the paper or note on your phone/tablet and do just what you said. If you haven't decided what to do, here are a few suggestions:

- 1. **Pay off debt**. This is the best thing you can do for yourself and family.
- 2. **Set up your emergency fund.** This is a minimum of \$1,000.00 and can be up to six months' salary. One thousand dollars will cover most auto and appliance breakdowns. For those of you still working, you need to cover your salary in case you are laid off or become disabled.
- 3. Make necessary repairs on your home/car.
- 4. Start your Individual Retirement Account (IRA).
- 5. Start that education fund for your children. You know the one you intended to set up right after they were born.
- 6. Set money aside for Christmas 2018. You can do this with a short-term investment account.

SCAM ALERT: Take care in choosing the agency that helps you complete your income tax return. Some tax preparers pop up this time of year and disappear just as quickly with your SSN, DOB, and refund. Before you know it, they have stolen your identity because you gave them all of the information they need. Stick with tax preparers you know. Many are offering instant refunds. They advance you some of your money up front (a loan) until your refund comes in. There is always a fee for this. If you are not in a bind, wait for your money.






*The morning of Saturday, February 3, 2018, the Union Grove Missionary Baptist Church Scholarship Committee took youth members of the church to the 14th Annual Black College Expo located in the Cobb Galleria Centre in Atlanta, Georgia. Of those youth members, they all attended high schools in the Houston County school system and their classifications ranged from sophomore to senior. Many of the students at the expo brought their high school transcripts and SAT/ACT scores to be reviewed by the representatives. They had the opportunity to meet with top Historically Black Colleges and Universities. The most popular venders in attendance were the institutions of Howard University, Fort Valley State University, Albany State University and Tuskegee University. There were also a few non-HBCU institutions there as well, such as, Georgia Military College and Ohio State University. Many of the universities allowed students to apply with them on the spot by waiving their application fee, and some even granted acceptances and awarded scholarships. There was a separate room where music students brought their instruments and auditioned for band scholarships. Fraternities and sororities were represented in a step show later that afternoon.

The trip to the expo was enlightening for the youth at Union Grove. They were able to network with other students and college representatives to learn about what it takes to get into the college of their choice. They walked away with several goody bags and information packets from the universities on how to apply, admission requirements and important deadlines and steps for applying for financial aid.

~ The Importance of Voting ~





Voting is a fundamental process that keeps our system of government working. Through elections, citizens have the ability to decide on who represents them in government, be it a local official, a state or national representative, or the president. With a government elected by its citizens and that affects every aspect of our lives from schools to healthcare to homeland security, **voting** is an **important** right in our society. By **voting**, you are making your voice heard and registering your opinion on how you think the government should operate.

On Election Day, voters will not only be able to select their representatives in government for the next term, but they also often have the ability to decide on measures like bond issues that grant the government permission to borrow money for

construction projects and other developments. And sometimes voters cast their ballots on social issues such as allowing same-sex marriage or banning smoking in restaurants and bars.

Mid-term elections are held halfway between Presidential elections. This year's election will be held on Tuesday, November 6, 2018. At this time, voters will elect one-third of all U.S. Senators, all 435 members of the U.S. House of Representatives, thirty-six state governors and many city mayors. Midterms determine which political party—Democratic or Republican—will control each chamber of Congress for the next two years. It is important to be proactive and get out in our communities and get more and more citizens registered and very important that once registered, we encourage and help them to get out to the polls and vote, either early or on election day. We must realize that voting in our local elections is just as important, if not more important than voting in the presidential election.

Reading up on the issues, the candidates, and researching the ballot is also the responsibility of the citizen voter and a responsibility that should not be taken lightly, because it is your voice, with the many others, in unison, that can change the direction of a community, state, nation, and even the world.

Anyone can get registered at Union Grove, just see Deacon Stephens, Jan Scott or Pastor Clarke for a voter registration form. If you are 65 or older or disabled and cannot get to the polls, absentee ballots are available at the church.

If we do not keep this important fabric alive in our communities, we are going to lose that which courageous people fought for and for which some lost their lives.




