

DON'T PANIC!

If I turn on my TV, "BREAKING NEWS" is everywhere. This new Coronavirus is spreading. What do I do? The virus has caused uncertainty in the stock market and it is going down every day. What should I do?

Don't panic. Even though the virus is in our state, it is thus far contained to two people in Fulton County and their family. They are quarantined and we should be fine. On the other hand, there may be other people bringing this virus or the flu in that are unaware they have it. We can protect ourselves a little bit by (1) Washing our hands frequently, (2) Not touching every surface we see, (3) Being aware of others in a crowd, i.e. is someone coughing, sneezing, having difficulty breathing, etc. If they are not family members, remove yourselves from their immediate vicinity. If you work in the public arena, get your instructions from your supervisors. Do as much as you are allowed in your workspace, wearing gloves, spraying disinfectant, or using wipes as often as possible.

As far as the stock market is concerned, let it ride. I expect to live to about 90 unless some drastic accident or illness comes out of the blue. Life expectance for most of us is at least another ten to twenty years past retirement. If you want your nest egg to give your 30 years into retirement, don't pull it out. First, you will have an enormous tax bill. Second, it won't give you the return you need to sustain your lifestyle in years to come.

Hopefully, they will have a vaccine for this virus within the year. The stock market will recover, and stocks will go back up. Now is the time to invest while prices are low. Remember the old saying, "Buy low, sell high".

It's not too late to put extra money away in your 40lK to help reduce your 2019 tax liability and increase the amount you are setting aside for your retirement.

It's tax time again. If you are expecting a refund this year, make a written plan to use it wisely. Here are a few of my usual recommendations:

- 1. Pay down your debt.
- 2. Invest in your home. Make those repairs or upgrades you have been talking about.
- 3. Start an education fund for your children/grandchildren.
- 4. Start or contribute to your Individual Retirement Account (IRA).
- 5. Set money aside for vacation or Christmas 2020.
- 6. Make an extra offering to your church.

NOTE: There are numerous virus and tax scams out there. Hold on to your money. Don't give out your account numbers, SSNs, Medicare/Medicaid numbers to anyone you haven't called. Remember, they made a copy at the office at the beginning of the year. They don't need to call.





~ Selma to Montgomery ~

With Governor George Wallace refusing to protect the marchers, President Johnson committed to do so by 1,900 members of the Alabama National Guard under federal command and many FBI agents and federal marshals, on Sunday, March 21, 1965. The third march began with about 3,200 marchers setting out for Montgomery, walking, averaging ten miles a day and sleeping in fields.

They arrived in Montgomery on March 24 and the state capitol on March 25, 25,000 strong, entering the capitol city in support of voting rights. The Voting Rights Act became law on August 6, 1965.

At the first march, Alabama State Troopers attacked civil rights demonstrators, including a young John Lewis outside Selma, Alabama on **Bloody Sunday**, March 7, 1965.

The second march took place on March 9, confronting troopers and police at the county end of the bridge, but when troopers stepped aside, Dr. King led them back to the church, obeying a federal injunction while seeking protection from federal court for the march. That night, a white group beat and murdered civil rights activist James Reeb, a Universalist Boston Minister.


