



Greetings everyone; as we continue in this Fall Quarter of our weekly Sunday School lessons let us continue to praise God for what He is doing. Although we are still in the midst of the COVID-19 virus with over 230,000 lives lost in these United States just remember God is still in control. For this quarter we are still in the Book of Exodus Chapters 19 - 24. The theme for the quarter is: Preparation of a Nation and we are in Unit II titled Instruction from Exodus Chapters 19 - 24.

The Bible itself is a Book of Instruction. Some years ago I used to use this acronym for B.I.B.L.E.; Basic Instruction Before Leaving Earth. The Bible is the instruction manual for the heart, soul, and mind of mankind. In Proverbs 4:13 it states "Hold firmly to my teachings and never let go. It will mean life for you." As we studied these lessons, we saw how God instructed His people in His ways, and how He corrected them when they strayed from His path.

Unit II: Instructions

This unit from the Book of Exodus covers Chapters 16 - 18. The twelve tribes are wandering in the wilderness as they journeyed from Egypt and Pharaoh. Moses is God's chosen leader for them and God tells Moses what he wants done. The people are learning to trust and depend on God.

In Lesson 1, God's First Instructions to Israel, Moses and the children of Israel are at Mount Sinai. God is about to reveal to Moses His plan for His chosen people. God's plan and His first command or instruction to Israel is "Obey my voice and keep my covenant and you will be treasure unto me above all other people." Those instructions given to the Twelve Tribes of Israel are the same instructions we have today which is to Obey the Voice of God and keep His covenant. In 1 Peter 2:4-10 Peter speaks of the Great Cornerstone in Jerusalem. Jesus is that Great Cornerstone and we must TRUST and HONOR Him.

In Lesson 2, God Gives the Ten Commandments; we examined the process through which God gave the Ten Commandments. The Ten Commandments are the foundational laws by which we are to understand our position before God and to show how we are to interact with others. In Commandments 1-4 it tells us about our obligation to God and Commandments 5-10 is our obligation to and with others. These commandments are not a requirement for salvation but are instruction for doing the Will of God. We must show God our thankfulness and love. As well as try to do the things that pleases Him. God always wants what is best for us and we should be happy to follow His laws.

In Lesson 3, God Confirms the Covenant, we examined what was required to confirm the covenant with God. Whenever a covenant was made there was a shedding of blood. Without the shedding of blood there is no remission of sin. After the confirmation of the covenant all the people agreed. This was a great responsibility that the people were undertaking. When the people made this covenant with God it did not last. No one could keep the law then and that's the same today. We come to God in FAITH with the shedding of the blood of Christ. Our obedience to the instruction given by God shows and demonstrates our faith in Him.

Finally in Lesson 4, *God Meets Moses Alone*, Moses and Joshua go up the mountain. The purpose of Moses' journey was to receive the Ten Commandments and the law that God had written with His own hand. Aaron and Hur are left behind to take care of any business or concerns in Moses' absence. Joshua is Moses' minister and he accompanies Moses. He would later go on to become the leader of the Israelite tribes after the death of Moses. His given name was Hoshea but Moses called him Joshua. Joshua stays a distance away and Moses goes up to meet God alone. For six days the cloud covered the mountain where the Glory of God abode. On the seventh day God summons Moses and Moses goes into the midst of the cloud. I believe during these six days of waiting Moses prayed and prepared himself to meet God. We must always prepare ourselves daily to meet God. No man knows the day or the hour so we must do all we can to be ready when He calls us.

In this unit on Instruction God is still in the preparation process for Israel to become a nation. Moses is God's delegate and God tells him all that must be done.


In our final Unit titled "Correction" we will be in Exodus Chapters 32 – 34.



I AM EVE

And the rib, which the Lord God had taken from man, made he a woman, and brought her unto the man. Genesis 2:22

"I was the first woman. I was in that beautiful garden named Eden and I was not alone. I had Adam, to whom I was a helpmate, and I had God. God was my Father, and He was good to me and provided for all of my needs. However, I just didn't understand why God told Adam He didn't want us to taste the fruit from the Tree of the Knowledge of Good and Evil. I grew more and more curious. Then we got company. It was a snake; and it spoke to me questions that sounded much like my own. But he took it even further, saying God just didn't want Adam and me to rise to His level. He told me that if we ate from the tree, we would be as God. He told us we would not die if we ate the forbidden fruit, although God told us that we would. I chose to believe the serpent. I didn't want to get in trouble with God, at least not by myself, so I talked Adam into tasting of the fruit of the tree with me.

As we did, terrible things happened. We saw everything around us through our altered, sinful eyes and no longer through the pure, unblemished vision we had known through our unbroken relationship with God. We knew we were in big trouble! So, we tried to run from God (which was futile since He is everywhere). Of course, God found us. The first thing Adam did was tell God I gave him the fruit to eat. What a tattletale! So, I explained to God it was really the serpent's fault because he is the one who tricked me. God held Adam and me accountable for our actions and He cast us out of the garden, never to return."

Why Her?

We all remember that Eve broke the only commandment God had given to her through Adam—she believed Satan's lies and ate from the only forbidden tree in the Garden of Eden. And she convinced Adam to do the same. As a result, she also became the agent through whom death entered the world. Wow, talk about your reputation preceding you! She had a lot to live down. It would seem that nothing good could ever have come from Eve. But her sin is not the only thing we remember about Eve; from her we also learn that God can use the worst in us for good. Eve's name means "source of life." Even though Eve is considered the source of death, as the mother of all living people, God allowed Eve to maintain her purpose as the mother of all life through her son, Seth. It was Seth's children who began to call on the name of the Lord. His children's children waited for the Messiah, one of Eve's own bloodline, to restore true life to all. What an honor God bestowed on this first of sinners.

About Her

Eve was made from the rib of Adam and was the first woman. Before they were driven out, Eve lived with Adam in the Garden of Eden. Among her sons were Cain, Abel, and Seth. She is the mother of all mankind and is responsible, along with Adam, for the first sin that separated us from God.

Apply Her

Eve's sin was that she reasoned and freely chose to be disobedient to what God said. Actually, at the point she made her decision, she didn't care what God said; she cared only for what she wanted. It was her selfishness and self-rule that separated Eve from God, but not from His love. It is the same with us. We can either choose to accept Jesus as our Lord and Savior, submit to His will, and spend all eternity with Him; or we can choose our own way without Him, which is the path of sin and eternal death.

Sarah

And God said, "Sarah thy wife shall bear thee a son indeed; and thou shalt call his name Isaac: and I will establish my covenant with him for an everlasting covenant, and with his seed after him."

Genesis 17:19

"I had prayed and prayed, but the Lord had not seen fit to let me have children. When it seemed God was never going to answer my prayers, I arranged for my husband, Abraham, to be with my handmaiden. That way, he could have a son to continue his line. Then God showed up. When I was old and worn out, I overheard him telling Abraham that I would give birth within a year. In my head, I was thinking, "What a joke." I'd already been through menopause! Unfortunately, I laughed out loud and God asked Abraham why I laughed. Then I lied and told God that I hadn't. But God had heard and said, "You did laugh". As badly as I feel about lying to Him, I am highly honored that He spoke to me and cared about what I thought. I've never heard much about God speaking to any women; but the God of the universe told me He would go against the natural and would supernaturally bless us with a son, Isaac—the answer to my lifelong prayers. I am a living testimony that, even when the earth treats women like second class citizens, God will answer our prayers. He is faithful even when we've given up asking."

Why Her?

Sarah, wife of Abraham, is considered one of the great women of faith in the Bible; but she also demonstrated a lack of faith when she got tired of waiting on God.

Jealousy and competition created some serious drama between Sarah and her ex-handmaiden.

God had promised Abraham, "Look now toward heaven, and tell the stars, if thou be able to number them: and he said unto him, So shall thy seed be." (Gen. 15:5). Yet, Sarah looked at all of her circumstances and determined that she could not be used in God's plan to multiply Abraham's seed. So, she gave another woman, Hagar, her Egyptian maid, to her husband as his wife so he could fulfill God's plan without her. After Hagar gave birth, Sarah saw that this might not have

been such a good plan. Jealousy and competition created some serious drama between Sarah and her ex-handmaiden. Through all the problems, Sarah still laughed to herself at the thought that God could open up her ninety-year-old womb to have children. She soon found that nothing is too great for God—Isaac was born to her in her old age. The strife was even greater once Isaac was born. Isaac was God's chosen vessel to carry on the lineage of Abraham; Hagar and Ishmael were soon forced to leave the camp and begin life in a new country. All the drama in Sarah's life with Hagar and the issues between their sons, Ishmael and Isaac, could have been avoided if Sarah had just waited for the Lord to do what He promised in His time and in His way. About Her Sarai (whose name God changed to Sarah as a symbol of His covenant with her, promising that He would covenant with her child) was both Abraham's wife and his half-sister—they had the same father, Terah, but different mothers. She is also the mother of Isaac and an ancestor in the lineage of Jesus Christ.

Apply Her.

Sometimes God whispers in our ears and mobilizes us to take action on His behalf to carry out His will. But Sarah had no such directive from God in choosing to give Hagar to Abraham. God doesn't need our help to move things along or to make things happen. Unless we hear from Him, we should remove our hands from manipulating the lives of others; even if we're doing what we think is best for them. In fact, we could be interfering with God's plans for that person's life and our own.

Find Her.

















~ PATIENCE ~


