Grace and peace to all of you from the Father of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. I pray all is well with you and your families as we continue to endure various trials in this season.

Sunday, November 1, 2020 has been established as a target date to re-open the Union Grove sanctuary for in-person worship! This is subject to change. I will continue to seek the Lord, talk to our staff and Church Council (pastors, elders, ministers, deacons, and trustees). We will also keep an eye on COVID-related data in the middle Georgia area. We will keep our church family posted on any changes via emails, Sunday morning announcements, and social media. But, as I announced at our Pull Up Worship at the Field of Dreams on Sunday, October 4th, our current plan is to re-open the sanctuary for in-person worship on Sunday, November 1, 2020.

Please be mindful of the church's re-opening plan. It is our guide for safely re-opening the sanctuary. I will need everyone in our church family to partner with me in making the re-opening happen decently and in order. After you have been away from your church home for so long, I want God glorified, of course, but I also want you abundantly blessed from being able to finally worship in the sanctuary again. My hope is that everyone who attends walks away from our worship experiences with an overwhelming sense of gladness that they worshipped at Union Grove. So, those of us in attendance will have to look out for one another. It is imperative that everyone in attendance follow whatever directions are given from our full-time staff, security team, ushers, and others responsible for our safety. Do not sit on pews where seating is not allowed! Seating in the balcony is not allowed until we can no longer seat persons on the floor level. We will have to demonstrate consideration for one another by wearing masks and practicing social distancing throughout the facility, to include the restrooms.

On that note, to worship as we promote social distancing, we will ask certain members to attend only on assigned Sundays. Some members will attend in-person worship on first and third Sundays. Others will attend on second and fourth Sundays. Some of you may have worshipped that way growing up in the rural areas. Fifth Sundays will be strictly virtual. This plan is for November and beyond. This is our approach to corporate worship until further notice. We will continue to stream all worship experiences on our various platforms. Here are the Sundays we're asking you to attend:

First & Third Sundays: A-K & W-Z families

Union Grove church family members last names beginning with A-K & W-Z are welcome to attend in-person worship in the sanctuary on first and third Sundays.

Second & Fourth Sundays: L-V families

Union Grove church family members last names beginning with L-V are welcome to attend in-person worship in the sanctuary on second and fourth Sundays.

Fifth Sundays

Strictly virtual with no one in the sanctuary except ministries essential to serve for the live stream worship experience: Security, Media, Music, & Ministers

Now, I need a HUGE favor: please do not take offense to this approach. It is simply an attempt to return to the sanctuary in the safest way we believe we can at the moment. Another option is to have multiple worship experiences on Sundays. The only way we would be able to use that approach is get more folks to commit to serving in essential ministries possibly all day on Sundays. Perhaps we can entertain multiple Sunday worship experiences further down the road. If you are willing to help us provide multiple Sunday worship experiences by committing to serving with the Ushers, Greeters, Security Team, Media, or Health Care Team, let me know. Please be aware, you may have to serve in whatever ministry you commit to all day each Sunday. Until we can garner enough commitment, please cooperate and only attend on the Sunday for your last name. And I still may need many of you to assist the ministries previously mentioned.

If you feel sick, please do not attend in-person worship! If you are uncomfortable being in a corporate worship setting, please feel free to worship via live stream or the conference call. No one, including our leaders, is to feel pressured to physically attend our worship experiences. It is not a sin nor is it carnal to prioritize your health and stay home where you feel safer. In re-opening the sanctuary, we are simply providing an option for in-person worship for those who feel comfortable with returning to the sanctuary. Everyone who opts to stay home due to health concerns has my support.

To give us an idea as to how many of you are willing to resume in-person worship in the sanctuary, please RSVP. Please call the church office at 478-922-5514 or send an email to <u>uniongrov1@aol.com</u> to give us an idea as to how many persons we can expect to attend worship.

There will still be no meetings held at the church. I need all leaders to utilize technology to communicate with their teams. We will host no events other than Sunday morning worship and Sunday school. Youth Bible study will continue to Zoom on Wednesday evenings. eManna Bible study will still be offered strictly online on Thursdays evenings. Funerals will continue to be conducted as graveside services only. The Vision Center is still not available for events or rentals. Any questions you may have should be answered in the church's re-open plan. Issues such as the Nursery, the vans, youth, etc. are addressed in our re-open plan. But if you still have any questions not addressed in the plan, feel free to call the church office and we'll be glad to assist you..

FIRST QUARTER OF FALL RECAP

I Cor. 12:1, 28 – Now concerning spiritual gifts...And God has set some in the church, first apostles, secondarily prophets, thirdly teachers ...

Greetings everyone, as we enter into the Fall Quarter of our weekly Sunday School lessons let us continue to praise God for what He is doing. We are still in the midst of the COVID-19 virus, but God is still in control. For the entire quarter we will be studying from the Book of Exodus as we recount the miraculous works of God for His chosen people. The theme for the quarter is: Preparation of a Nation which is divided into three units.

Unit I: Provision - Exodus Chapters 16 - 18

Unit II: Instruction – Exodus Chapters 19 - 25

Unit III: Correction - Exodus Chapter 32 - 34

This study will show how God provided for His people, how He instructed them in His ways, and how He corrects them when they stray from His path. The lesson for them is as relevant and prevalent now as it was then.

Unit I: Provisions

This unit from the Book of Exodus covers chapters 16 - 18. The twelve tribes are wandering in the wilderness as they journeyed from Egypt and Pharaoh. Moses is God's chosen leader for them and God tells Moses what he wants done. The people are learning to trust and depend on God.

In Lesson 1 while journeying through the wilderness they run out of food and begin to murmur and complain to Moses, blaming Moses for their situation. God comes to their rescue by providing bread from Heaven called Manna and Quail for meat. This lets us know whatever we are in need of, God will provide.

Later in Lesson 2, they cannot find water and again they complain to Moses and they are almost ready to kill him. However, God comes to their rescue again by providing from a rock. This was not a small amount of water just for the people. This was a river of water. Enough water to quench their thirst and their livestock. When you look to God trust and Believe that God will do the miraculous.

In Lesson 3 as they continue their journey to the Promise land where they encounter opposition from the Amalekites. The Amalekites did not want them to come through their territory and a battle takes place. The Jews were not accustomed to fighting so God prepares them and they won the battle.

Finally in Lesson 4 Moses' father-in-Law, Jethro, comes to bring Moses' wife and son and sees all the duties Moses has to perform and suggests delegating responsibility to others. Moses listened to the advice of Jethro, his father-in-law, and appointed able men to judge the people on small matters and He would Judge the larger more serious matters.

Lesson 4 reminds me of our government. We have a President and Senators and Representatives in Congress to make laws for the nation. Each of the 50 states has Governors, Mayors, Councilmen/women and other representatives. It takes all of this for a Nation to prosper.

In preparation for becoming a nation, these four lessons illustrated how God was teaching the twelve tribes to trust and rely on His provision and His guidance.

There was no Sunday School on September 27th and Oct 4th due to outdoor worship.

May God continue to bless this ministry as we strive to share the Good News of Jesus Christ our Lord and Savior.

** POLL WORKERS **

Workers are always needed to work at the precincts on election day. In addition to precinct workers on occasion there is a need for precinct managers. By law, mangers and poll workers are required to attend training by the Board of Elections, prior to each election.

In order to be a poll worker, you must meet the following criteria:

- Be a citizen of the United States and a resident of Houston County.
- Be at least 16 years of age.
- Be able to read, write, and speak the English language.
- No person holding public office or Candidate for Office may serve as a poll worker.
- An immediate relative of an elected official cannot serve in an election where the relative is a candidate.

Election Day workers must report by 6:00 a.m. and stay until the Election is completed including required duties at poll location, typically 8:00/8:30 p.m.

2020 will be a pivotal year for building power in our communities. The results of the 2020 Census and elections will shape the course of our nation for decades to come.

The Constitution requires the federal government to count every person living in the United States, regardless of citizenship, every ten years. The first census was in 1790 and the next census is this year, 2020. The census form will be open for response nationwide beginning in March -- online, by telephone, or with a paper questionnaire.

HOW THE CENSUS DIRECTLY IMPACTS OUR FAMILIES & COMMUNITIES:



Census data help determine where & how billions of dollars are spent on programs like SNAP, Medicaid, CHIP, the National School Lunch Program, and Head Start.



Businesses use census data to decide where to build new factories, stores, and offices. Therefore, filling out the census can help bring more job opportunities to your community.



The results of the census also determine how many seats each state gets in the U.S. House of Representatives and how many votes each state gets in the Electoral College.



State officials use the census to redraw the boundaries of their congressional and state legislative districts in ways that account for population changes.

WHAT'S AT STAKE IN 2020:

- Black people are among the least accurately counted populations in the country, undermining our political power and costing us billions in lost resources and opportunities.
- Over 800,000 Black people weren't counted in the 2010 Census, and experts warn that thousands of Black people could be missed again in the 2020 Census if we don't take the census and encourage our community to take the census, too.

WHAT'S DIFFERENT ABOUT THE 2020 CENSUS:

- The Census Bureau used to ask people to respond to the census mostly by mail. This year, people will be able to respond
 by phone or on the internet.
- The Census Bureau will urge households to respond via the internet if they can, but it also welcomes responses by phone
 or on the paper questionnaire if people prefer those methods.

IS MY INFORMATION SAFE?

- The information you provide on the census is confidential. Your responses are protected by federal law and can only be used to produce statistics. It is a federal crime for the Census Bureau to:
 - allow your information to be used to determine your eligibility for government programs
 - share your information with immigration enforcement or law enforcement agencies

STEP-BY-STEP



Each household will receive a notification in the mail with the census website and your unique User ID. Households can respond to the census online, or by phone without a unique ID. Census Bureau staff might call to confirm the address if it doesn't match the address on file.



Beginning in March, the head of each household will be able to complete the 2020 Census online. Due to COVID-19, households now have until October 31 to respond.



On my2020census.gov, people are asked to enter their unique User ID. The site allows users to log back into the survey if the session times out or if they need to come back later.



In August, the Census Bureau will begin following up with people who haven't filled out the questionnaire.



By the 4th mailing, people who haven't responded will receive a paper form.

GENSUS TIMELINE OF ACTIVITIES

JANUARY

Census Bureau begins advertising efforts.

Census Bureau staff continue doing outreach in communities, verifying addresses and other information.

MARCH (

The Census Bureau opens the questionnaire help line.

All U.S. households are invited to respond to the 2020 Census questionnaire.

- All households have three options to respond: internet, telephone, and paper.
- Individual housing units will be invited either by mail or by hand delivery (to rural, PO Box, and non-USPS housing units).
- You should count everyone who lives and sleeps in your home all or most of the time as of April 1st, 2020. It doesn't matter if they're on the lease or if they're blood relatives. Everyone counts!

 Remember to count all kids (including babies) who live in your home, even if they aren't related to you. All kids count!

APRIL 1

Census Day

People can continue to self-respond to the 2020 Census until the extended enumeration period ends on October 31. If you don't want a census taker to come to your door, self-respond by mail, phone, or at my2020census.gov before mid-July.

AUGUST (

The Census Bureau begins to follow-up with households that did not self-respond to the questionnaire.

You may see census takers in PPE in your neighborhood as early as mid-July. Real census takers will have a valid photo ID badge with a U.S. Department of Commerce watermark and expiration date. Real census takers will never ask you for your social security number, credit card info, banking info, or money.

OCTOBER 31

Census Bureau finishes the count for the 2020 Census, which has been extended due to COVID-19.

STAND UP AND BE COUNTED!

Please don't forget to complete your census report. Yes, this is my column about finances. That is the very reason you need to complete your census and be counted. Every dollar that the city, county, and state receives is one less dollar you have to spend from your personal resources for the local economy. If you need help, just call me. I am willing to visit you with my laptop, Zoom with you online, or talk you thru it on the phone. Just be counted. That includes everyone in your house.

SCAM ALERT: I usually put these at the end; however, I thought it important enough to slide in here. I have been receiving at least five calls a day from someone claiming to be from Amazon. They say someone has charged a certain amount to my account and that in order to stop the charge, I need to press one. I was curious to see what they wanted to do so I pressed one (1). A man came on and told me I needed to be in front of my computer for him to remove the charges. I asked why but he never answered. I then hung up on him. I always check my accounts and there are no fraudulent charges on any of them. Don't know what they were planning to do, but it wasn't good. Always hang up and then call your credit card company of Amazon directly and see if there is a problem.

It is finally fall and we haven't been able to enjoy the summer yet. Not to worry, God has a plan. He hasn't shared it with me, but I know He has one. Since you couldn't travel like you had planned this year (We cancelled four trips), we all should have saved some money. No shopping for new clothes, more savings, no movies, more savings, etc. What are we to do with that money?

- a. Since I am behind in my Christmas shopping, online I will be going. There are deep discounts in every store. Since many of the stores were closed for several months, our local stores will have even better discounts. They need to move some merchandise to make up for lost revenue.
- b. Pay off some bills. Remember to pay off your major credit cards, but don't close the accounts. This gives you more available credit, which helps your FICO score. If you have credit at a finance company, pay out and close the account.
- c. Build up your emergency fund.

Now is a good time to get a copy of your credit report from **Annualcreditreport.com**. You can get one free once a year from either Equifax, Experian, or TransUnion. If you use a different website, you may have to pay. Other sites sell your information.





** Reminder **


