HAPPY NEW YEAR!!!

We made it! It's another new year and I ain't gone! We can all say/sing that. God allowed us to see another new year, 2022. It's time for a little reflection. What did you expect from 2021, and what are you expecting in 2022?

Let's look back just a little. Did you set yourself up for success? What was success for you? What were your 2021 resolutions, goals? Did you meet them, exceed them, or forget about them? Whichever way it goes, 2021 is over and we either did it or we didn't.

What about 2022? What are we expecting? Whatever we set up in 2021 is what we will get in 2022. Some things are out of our control, and we'll leave those things to God. However, there are things we can do now to insure a good year.

- a. Get closer to God. Just as with our finances, this is a deliberate act on your part. If you are not already doing so, read at least one scripture a day. You can start by reading the assignment given in the Daily Bread. Say a prayer of thanks every morning and before bedtime. Before you know it, you're talking to God all thru the day.
- b. Make a budget for the year for the entire family. Engage other family members as they contribute to the cost of running the household. Include tithing in your budget.
- c. Share your income/expenses with your spouse. Too many husbands and wives find themselves unprepared when their spouse passes away. Regardless of who pays the bills, each partner should be aware of what the household expenses are and when they are due.
- d. Review all financial products and make sure they are up to date and relevant. Every product, including checking accounts, should have a beneficiary named.
- e. Make/update your will.
- f. Determine which, if any, bill you want to pay off this year. Look at all your debt and based on balances and interest rates, pick the first to eliminate this year.

NOTE: Don't close major credit cards once you have paid them out!





As we turn the calendar for a new year, how many of us try to turn our life around in the form of a New Year's resolution? Although we might not want to admit it, we all need to make changes in our lives. We have the problem of enjoying the pleasures of the present rather than thinking about the pleasures that we might get in the future. We might have grown physically, e.g. lost some of that weight or financially (pay raise) but did our spiritual life produce something of value to God? Did our character improve in ways that exhibit positive behavior? We, as His children should depart from the sin or wrongs of the past year and live the new year with determination to change things or behavior that need changing.

Some people say that they don't make resolutions for they fail to change their behavior and more than likely fall back into their old ways. They believe that these commitments are vows to the Lord. We should not be entering into vows or resolutions casually for you are setting yourself up for failure. However, if we fail we should use this failure as an opportunity to learn a lesson and strengthen our prayer life that will help us to develop a stronger faith. Employing prayers, tell the Lord how you want to live a different life and how you're going to need his help. Tell Him that you're going to place yourself in His hands and you're going to need a lot of help to make these changes. DECEMBER RECAP

I Cor. 12:1, 28 – Now concerning spiritual gifts ...And God have set some in the church, first apostles, secondarily prophets, thirdly teachers ...

Adult Sunday School Teachers

Elder Connie Dinkins, Brother Michael White, and Minister Arie Freeman, Jr.

Our study for this unit presented a series of scripture related to the birth of Jesus. Scriptures will be from the Old and New Testament. We will examine Isaiah and the Gospel of Matthew, Mark, Luke, John, and Philippians. We get to see how all these lessons relate to the event in Isaiah. Some 400 years after the prophecy by Isaiah all what was prophesied was about to happen. Jesus' birth, as miraculous as it was changed the world. For the month of December, Elder Connie Dinkins and Minister Arie Freeman facilitated the lessons. This quarter's lessons will be dealing with Triumph, which is the theme for the quarter. Unit I was titled Jesus' Triumph Arrival.

Unit 1: Jesus' Triumph Arrival:

This unit covers Jesus' earthly parents Mary and Joseph, His triumph entry into Jerusalem, Simeon waiting to see the Christ child, and the actual birth as foretold by the Apostle Paul to the Philippians and Jesus washing His disciples at the Last Supper. In this unit we got a firsthand look at our victorious Savior's birth and His triumph over Satan and how good triumphs over evil.

Lesson 1: Sorrow Before Triumphs: This unit began with the announcement of Jesus' forthcoming birth in Matthew. Mary, a teenager, who is engaged to Joseph is pregnant and Joseph is deciding what he should do. The Lord appears to Joseph and explains what has taken place and tells him not to fear for what has happened is of the Holy Ghost doings. He is told Mary will have a son and his name will be Jesus. Later in the lesson from John's gospel Jesus and His disciples are at Lazarus' house and Mary anoints Jesus' feet with expensive oil and wipes His feet with her hair. Judas protests at what he considers a waste of expensive oil. Jesus' response was to leave Mary alone for what she was doing was needful for His upcoming burial. Points to remember (1.) When we have decisions to make it is always wise to wait to hear from God. (2.) God has the power to calm our fears and give us the peace to do His biddings. (3.) We should count it a privilege to be in the presence of the Lord. (4.) What we do for the lord is never a waste.

Lesson 2: A King Comes Forth: The prophecy of Isaiah has come to reality and Jesus is born. The names Jesus is to be called speaks of His position and power, Wonderful, Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, and Prince of Peace. Now from the Gospel of John we have Jesus making His entry into Jerusalem. It was prophesied that the King would be riding on a donkey and Jesus fulfilled Isaiah's prophecy. Jerusalem was crowded with followers and those who had heard about Jesus raising Lazarus from the dead. People were throwing their clothing and palm branches along the path for Jesus shouting "Hosanna, Blessed is the king of Israel." This made the council members and religious leaders very angry. With all this happening, the disciples did not fully understand what was happening until Jesus was raised from the dead. Points to remember: (1). Jesus is the One who can fulfill all our needs. (2). Because of God's love for us Jesus became flesh to save us from our sins.

(3.) When you have heard or witness the power of God, you have a mission to tell others. (4). God's plan will always happen just as he said. (5.) When the time is right, God we give us the proper understanding.

Lesson 3: A Mission from Birth (CHRISTMAS): From the Gospel of Luke, a man named Simeon was present at Jesus' dedication at the temple. Simeon was waiting patiently for the consolation or comfort of Israel. It had been revealed to him that he would not die until he saw the Messiah, the consolation of Israel. Israel was under Roman rulership during this time. After seeing Jesus, Simeon was ready to die in peace. In John gospel many had come to see Jesus. Some Greek or Gentiles wanted to meet Jesus. Because other race of people were being converted and were seeking knowledge, Jesus knew His time was drawing nearer. Jesus made it clear, if we are to serve Him we must be faithful and obedient. Points to remember: (1.) When we receive a word from the Lord, we should remain faithful. (2.) Our encounter with Jesus is very important. (3.) Everyone in a crowd is not there for the same reasons. Be aware. (4.) Our service to the Lord might cause us to make some sacrifices.

Lesson 4: A Humble Lord is Born: This lesson is from Philippians 2 and John 13. The Apostle Paul talks to the Philippians about their attitude. They should have the mind and attitude of Christ. He tells them of the type of man Jesus is. Being God in the flesh became a servant to all and was not ashamed. He was humble and obedient even to the death on the cross. This attitude of Christ exalted Him highly in God's eyesight and was given the highest name above all names. That being said, at the name of Jesus every knee in heaven, in earth, and under the earth must bow. John the Gospel picks up with Jesus, after washing his disciples' feet, instructs them that they must do the same. Jesus' action was a show of humility. If you call me master and I wash your feet you must do the same. Jesus did not just talk the talk, he put action behind what he said. Humility is not prideful nor boastful. Points to remember: (1). If our Lord and Savior can humble himself, we must do likewise. (2). Our service to the Lord is not demeaning or unwarranted. We must go that extra mile to be of service when possible. (3). We are to follow the example Jesus displayed. (4). We are not working for earthly rewards or gratification. We are working to please God. (5). If the task is not beneath Jesus, it should not be beneath us.




