Our study for this quarter looks at the First letter Paul writes to the Church at Corinth. Paul had been told about the division within the Church and some of the things that were happening. Paul writes to address these issues. The Corinthian church is a newly started church. Paul spent 18 months there and was now in Ephesus. We get to see how Paul rebukes and challenges the Corinthians. There is always room for growth for no church is perfect. For the month of March Brother Michael White and Minister Arie Freeman facilitated the lessons. This quarter, lessons will be dealing with Training, which is the theme for the quarter. Unit I was titled Instruction to a Troubled Church.

Unit 1: Instructions to a Troubled Church:

Lesson 1: Division in Corinth: This lesson begins with Paul getting word that there is trouble brewing in the church amongst the members. This church is situated in what could be considered an international hub for visitors. Foreigners are constantly coming and going. Corinth was once under Greek and Roman authority and worldly ideology. Idol worshipping and lack of unity. Paul begins his letter by greeting and praising the members. This is Paul's approach in all the letters he would write from Romans to Philemon. There is division because of backsliding, taking sides, choosing who to follow, and leaders overlooking serious wrong doings. Paul reminds them that all they need is Christ, and they should be grateful. Paul encourages them to be of the same mind. Paul had gotten word that they were choosing who to follow as if Christ is divided. Some chose Apollos, some Cephas, some Paul, and some chose to follow Christ. The point is this is only one we should follow, Jesus Christ. He was the one who died for us, crucified on that Cross, raised to life by God, and now sits at His right hand. Christ is the one we owe our Salvation and righteousness. There is no favoritism in Christ. When we follow the teachings of Christ, we are heading in the right direction. The people that were trying to follow were saying things that appealed to their way of thinking. We should have only one leader and that leader should be Points to remember (1.) We must continue to study the word for ourselves and examine everything Christ. others may say. (2.) God is not divided is word is for everyone. You have a choice. (3.) Others my speak with eloquent words that sound good. But everything that sounds good is not good. (4.) Always look to Jesus in all you say and do.

Lesson 2: True Wisdom: Some might say that Corinth was not an ideal place for Paul to start a church. Corinth was an international hub. People were coming in and out. It was a commercial port which was governed by Greeks and now Rome. The people were accustomed to worshipping idols and they were young in the faith. Weak Christians, Immature Christians. The prophecy of Isaiah has come to reality and Jesus is born. Paul made a point of letting them know that while it seems foolish to them, it was the power of God that drew them to Him. It was Apollos, Peter, or Him. God took a nobody and made them somebody. While you are seeking worldly wisdom, true Wisdom comes only from God. The things Paul preached seems foolish to them because Christ was crucified. Paul and those with him were committed to preaching the gospel. There is no comparing the wisdom and strength of God with that of the world. Paul reaffirmed to them that none of them were wise, noble, or intellectual, yet God chose them. God takes the foolishness and weakness of the world to confound the wise. You have nothing to boast about because it was all God. We have a new identity in Christ. Our salvation is because of Christ. Our righteousness, sanctification, and redemption can only be found in Jesus. If we boast, we boast only about God. Points to remember: (1). Human skills and knowledge will never be better than God's. (2). The things we think are foolish, God uses them to demonstrate His supremacy. (3.) We should not let our intellect and philosophies keep us from trusting God. (4). Godly wisdom is humility, service, and compassion while worldly wisdom is pride, boasting, and material success.

Lesson 3: Christ – Our Only Foundation: It is very important to have a solid foundation from which to build. Every builder understands that structures need a solid foundation. The Church must also be built on a solid, firm foundation. Jesus saw in Peter the foundation needed to build the church. Peter's divine inspiration to Jesus' question who do you say I am? Peter responded "You are the Messiah, the Son of the Living God. Jesus is the foundation of the church, and each member of the body must build from this foundation. When Paul left Corinth, Apollos came behind him and continued to build on the foundation that Paul had laid, which was in Jesus Christ. We are the church and the body of Christ and God's Holy temple. God's temple must not be defiled. We don't know it all and should not act as if we do. All our worldly wisdom is useless apart from God. We must not place our hopes and values in the wisdom of humans. Our riches and rewards in Christ are much more than man's. We must dig deep into the Word of God and have an established prayer life. We must follow the basic doctrines of the Christian faith. We must remain firmly fixed on Jesus for He is the solid foundation from which we build. On Christ the solid rock I stand all else is just quicksand. Points to remember: (1.) Jesus is the only foundation from which we teach. (2.) Our churches, our homes, and our families must be built on Jesus. (3.) We are the temple of God and His Holy Spirit dwells in us. (4.) We must be faithful to God's word.

Lesson 4: Members of Christ: In this lesson we are told that we are free to do anything, but that freedom comes with a price. Sexual immorality will ruin the body. Our bodies are the temple of God and sexual immorality corrupts the temple. Brother White emphasized from Chapter 5 that the church should have condemned the man for having sexual relations with his father's wife. If we cannot judge simple matters, how will you be able to judge larger more complex matters. The introductory comment to the lesson makes two very pointed statements. What are we living for? Who are we living for? These are questions every born-again believer needs to address. We were created to serve the Lord and our bodies belong to Him. We are part of Christ, and we must take care of our bodies. Sexual sins defile the body, and we should avoid sexual sin. We are told to Flee fornication, run from sexual sin. No other sin affects the body as does sexual immorality. Our bodies are the Temple of the Holy Spirit. Our bodies do not exist for our own pleasures, and we cannot do whatever we please with it. We are members of Christ. Points to remember: (1). We have spiritual freedom in Christ Jesus. (2). The way we live has an impact on those around us who do not know Christ. (3). We have one foundation, and that foundation is Jesus Christ.

In April we will finish up Unit 1, <u>Instructions to a Troubled Church</u> with lessons 4-8, all from 1 Corinthians, Minister Freeman will facilitate.

My prayer is for God to continue to bless this ministry as we strive to share the Good News of Jesus Christ our Lord and Savior.

Welcome Spring
