


## **Church Voting Process**

## ~ Message from the Pastor ~

#### When You're Weak

1 Cor. 12:5-10

Weakness is a natural part of our lives. There is no vaccine to prevent it. Fatigue and exhaustion of all sorts—mental, physical, emotional, or spiritual can make their way into the inbox of your life. There will be times when you will feel weak. What do you do?

#### 1. Determine for yourself what it means to be weak (v.5)

<sup>5</sup> That experience is worth boasting about, but I'm not going to do it. I will boast only about my weaknesses.

The Corinthians deemed Paul weak. When compared to other more assertive apostles or speakers, Paul, in their opinion, didn't cut it. Many of them wrote Paul off and dismissed him as an apostle. They didn't care much for what he had to say.

Paul did not deny his weakness. In fact, he boasted about it. Paul argued however, by virtue of all he had suffered, he was actually very strong (2 Cor. 11:23-28). Paul did not allow the Corinthians to determine for him what it meant to be weak. He determined for himself what it meant to be weak and saw how God's grace made weakness a blessing. I suggest you do the same.

#### 2. Look out for yourself by praying for yourself (v.8)

<sup>8</sup> Three different times I begged the Lord to take it away.

It is not a sin to pray for yourself! Praise God for those who pray for us, and we should definitely pray for others. But it is not a sin or sign of pride to look out for yourself by praying for yourself.

Pray for yourself and trust God to respond! Just as the Lord responded to Paul, He will respond to you. He responded to Paul reassuring him of the power of His sufficient grace. God's sufficient grace is at your disposal, too. Appropriate it as you pray without ceasing...for yourself.

#### 3. Re-evaluate God's grace for yourself (v.9)

<sup>9</sup> Each time he said, "My grace is all you need. My power works best in weakness."

Grace is God's unmerited favor. Grace is God moving on our behalf to do for us what we cannot do for ourselves even though we don't deserve Him taking such action. Grace is awesome! Grace is amazing! Grace changes everything!

God's grace was something Paul already had. He needed to re-evaluate it and understand that he was being used by the grace of God, kept by the grace of God, and strengthened by the grace of God. Sufficient grace suggests Paul already had sufficient strength he needed to keep living and continue serving. Whenever you're feeling weak, re-evaluate God's sufficient grace in your life.


Paul expected his thorn to be miraculously removed. Grace *is* the miracle! It's a miracle you're still here! It's a miracle that you haven't lost your mind! It's a miracle that you're strong enough to continue serving the God of your salvation!

In closing, when you're weak, do this:

- ⇒ Determine for yourself what it means to be weak.
- ⇒ Look out for yourself by praying for yourself.
- ⇒ Re-evaluate God's grace for yourself!

Now, be strong, be encouraged, and enjoy the journey!







## ~ ADULT SUNDAY SCHOOL ^ JANUARY RECAP

I Cor. 12:1, 28 – Now concerning spiritual gifts ... And God have set some in the church, first apostles, secondarily prophets, thirdly teachers ...

#### **Adult Sunday School Teachers**

#### Elder Connie Dinkins, Brother Michael White, and Minister Arie Freeman, Jr.

Our study for this unit presents a series of scripture and text related to the teaching of Jesus during His earthly ministry. All of the scripture text will come from the Book of John. However, there will be many background scriptures from the Gospels of Matthew, Mark, and Luke as well as other New Testament books. All of these lesson and studies are for our edification and understanding. The same lessons taught to the disciples by Jesus are the same lessons we are to use today. Let us remain encouraged for Christ is always watching over us and He is with us. For the month of January Brother Michael White and Minister Arie Freeman facilitated the lessons. This quarter lessons will be dealing with Triumph, which is the theme for the quarter. Unit II was titled Teaching on Truth and Trials.

#### Unit 2: Teaching on truth and Trials:

In this unit we will focus on Jesus' earthly ministry and teaching to His disciples. He spends time with them and prepares them for what they will be required to do. He lets them know it will not be easy and they will face opposition. The same things Jesus told His disciples 2,000+ years ago still hold true today. Always speak TRUTH, the Word of God and in this earthly life we will have frustration and opposition which are our TRIALS. Let us not lose sight of the fact that all of these lessons are given to prepare us to live a godly life and to follow the examples Jesus displayed.

Lesson 1: The Way, the Truth, and the Life: From the Gospel of John 14; This lesson comes after Jesus has predicted His death and that Peter would deny him even after Peter stated he would die for Jesus. He tells them not to trouble themselves for He is going away to prepare a place for them in Heaven, His Father's House. He tells them where He is going now, they cannot follow but will come later. Thomas says we don't know where you are going so can we know the way. Jesus then tell them all He is the Way, the Truth, and the Life. The only way for them to get to Heaven is through Him.is talking and teaching His disciples. Points to remember (1.) Don't get too concern with your life on earth. (2.) Jesus has prepared an eternal home for us in Glory. (3.) We must follow Jesus in all He said for us to do. Do the works the glorifies God. (4.) Don't be swayed by this world to try to seek riches now. Give God the praise for what he has allowed you to accomplish. (5.) Remember, Jesus speaks for God and has shown us and told us all that is required.

Lesson 2: Abide in the True Vine: From the Gospel of John 15; It is important that Jesus stated that He is the True Vine and God is the Gardner. God prepared His Son for the task of being the only way of entering Heaven. We cannot produce fruit if we are not connected to Jesus. When we are disconnected from Jesus, we are spiritual dead. God prunes us. Discipline is pruning. When we go astray, God will do what is necessary to bet us back on track. Jesus said "If you abide in me and I abide in you we will produce much fruit. Isaiah tells us that Israel was God chosen vineyard, but they did not produce good fruit. That is why Jesus came to show us the Way. Staying connected to Jesus will enable us to endure the trials and struggles of life. Jesus' teaching is His way of pruning us and preparing us to lead by His example. We stay connected by Reading His Word, Meditating on His Word and having a regular Prayer life. Points to remember: (1). It is important to stay connected to Christ. (2). Every believer has a responsibility to share the Good News, Spread the Word. (3.) When we are apart from Christ we are doomed. (4). As Christian it should be our desire to bear much fruit for God. (5.) As parents, we have a responsibility to teach our children and showing them the importance of staying connected to Jesus.

Lesson 3: Peace and Trouble: From the Gospel of John 16: Jesus is teaching explicitly before going to Calvary. Jesus speaks about Joy and Sorrow as well as comfort in times of tribulation. Earlier Jesus had told His disciples that the world would hate them but they must remember that the world hated Jesus first.

They hated me with cause or reason. But Jesus promised to send them an Advocate, (the Holy Spirit of Truth). The Holy Spirit will come only when I am gone. Jesus explained to them the works of the Spirit. The Holy Spirit is the third person of the Trinity. The Holy Spirit convicts us, tells us of God's righteousness, and of the coming judgment. The Holy Spirit will guide us into all truth. You will have sadness when I die, but when I rise again you see me again you will have joy. After my Resurrection, the way has been prepared for you to ask God yourself for the things you need in My Name. You will now have direct access to God the Father. Jesus warned them that they would have troubles. We can find peace in the midst of our troubles in Jesus. Jesus is the only source of true peace. This world is filled with trials and tribulation and Jesus is our source of real peace. Because Jesus has overcome thew world. Points to remember: (1.) When we allow the Holy Spirit to do its job, we are obeying God. (2.) We will have painful situations in this life, but we can have Joy in Jesus. (3.) We must rely on Jesus and trust Jesus, by faith. (4.) As we allow our faith to grow by trusting Jesus we get a better knowledge and understanding of our purpose. (5.) We have victory in Jesus and the world cannot take away what God has guaranteed..

Lesson 4: Jesus' Prayer for His Disciples: From the Gospel of John 17; we will examine what is called the Highly Priestly Prayer of Jesus. Although Jesus prayed often, this is the longest recorded prayer of Jesus in the Bible. Jesus knows His earthly time is coming to a close, and His death is near. He spends time in prayer with His Father, God. Prayer is the tool that gives us strength and peace. It is the most powerful toll we have as we go through the trials of life. Jesus not only prays for himself, He prays for His disciples and for all who would believe in Him throughout history. We are included in that prayer that Jesus prayed. It is encouraging to know that Jesus is still praying for us today in 2022. Points to remember: (1). He starts by tell God, "I have finished the work you gave me". We must do what God has given us (2). He prays for unity. We must stay together, be of the same mind with the same goals and objectives (for all to be saved). (3). Jesus prays for Protection, not for himself, but for His disciples. He knows that they will face trials and oppositions and He want them to have His Joy, Peace, and Love overflowing in them. We too need the Joy, Peace, and Love of Christ overflowing in us as we face the trials of life. (4). Lastly, He prays that they be sanctified (Set apart and made pure). They were being sent out on a mission and they had to meditate, pray and obey the teachings they had been taught. We have a task to do our part to make the world a better place for ALL.

#### Unit 3: Triumph over Trials:

Lesson 1. Jesus' Arrest: From the Gospel of John 18. The arrest of Jesus is the culmination of close to three year plotting by of the religious rulers and leaders. Because of envy and jealousy, they were bent on destroying Jesus' Ministry. Never think for a minute the enemy is content. Scripture tells us the enemy (Satan) is like a roaring lion, seek whom to destroy. Jesus had just concluded His triumph entry into Jerusalem and had finished eating with the disciples. Judas had been told by Jesus to do what he must do. Jesus, along with his disciples go to The Garden of Gethsemane to pray. The Disciples are charged with keeping watch. Although willing, they fell fast asleep. Three times Jesus returned and found them sleeping. Jesus agonized in prayer in the Garden. God sent an Angel to strengthen and refresh Him. Later the soldiers were led to the Garden by Judas. When Jesus identified Himself to the soldiers by saying I AM He, they fell to the ground. Jesus willingly turned Himself over to the soldiers and requested the let His disciples go. When Peter realized what was happening, he was ready to protect Jesus. He drew his sword and cut of the high priest's slave ear. Jesus ordered Peter to put away the sword and Jesus healed the man's ear. Jesus was bound and led to Annas house. Points to remember: You can have triumph over your trials when you: (1). Do your best to remain under control and let God fight your battle. (2). Our dependence on God will help us to get through the trials of Life. (3). When we follow Jesus, will face opposition because the enemy is always busy. (4). We are in good hands when we have Jesus on our side. (5). In our trials and troubles, we are not alone. Jesus is with us.

In February we will continue with the unit, <u>Triumph over Trials</u> from the Gospel of John chapters 18-21. We will discuss Peter's denial, Pilate questioning Jesus and Jesus' crucifixion and death. Minister Freeman and Minister Hardee will be facilitating.

My prayer is for God to continue to bless this ministry as we strive to share the Good News of Jesus Christ our Lord and Savior?




#### **Children's Church**

## FEBRUARY THE MONTH FOR LOVERS!

John 15:13 "Greater love hath no man than this, that a man lay down his life for his friends."

This scripture talks about Christ's great sacrifice for us. Have you ever thought about what it would take for you to give up your life for someone else? What about your family? What are you willing to give up for them?

I am not asking you to give up your life for your family, just a little self-gratification for your children and (future) grandchildren. What type of financial legacy will you leave? There is an old song by the Temptations, "Papa was a Rolling Stone." The lyrics go like this "Papa was a rolling stone. Wherever he laid his hat was his home. All he left us was a loan." Will this be the song they sing about you?

It's not too late to start your financial legacy. Here are some things you can do:

- a. Have sufficient life insurance to cover more than your burial. How will your family live once your income is no longer coming in?
- b. Make sure you have a will. Even if you don't own real estate, someone may to be responsible for changing titles for vehicles and distributing jewelry or other personal items. A will saves your executor time and money.
- c. Make sure you have named beneficiaries for all your financial assets, i.e., life insurance, IRAs, 401ks, checking and savings accounts.
- d. Open your mind to investing in stocks and bonds. It is never too late to start saving for your future and that of your children.
- e. Stopping making new debt.

There was an article in the Telegraph on January 30th, 2022, entitled "Survey: Only 44% Have Savings to Pay For a \$1,000 Surprise". If you had an unexpected event occur, such as a major car repair, replacing the washer/dryer or TV, would you be able to do that without going into debt? Using that credit card is creating debt. If you don't have one, start your emergency fund today. You can set aside a small amount of money each pay period. Eat out one less time each week and save what you would have spent. For just two people to eat out these days you will spend no less that \$20 for drive thru. If you sit down somewhere you are looking at about \$50, including the tip. Once you get your emergency fund established, continue saving for your legacy.

**SCAM ALERT:** I received a call advising me I had won \$4.5 Million and a new car. The man proceeded to tell me that I had been entered automatically because I had paid my credit card bills on time. All I had to do was pay the tax fee to the banker. I had several options to pay this tax, money order, check, and money card. As soon as I paid the tax, my money would be released. I spoke to him about 30 minutes. As long as he was talking to me, he was not calling/scamming someone else.

## Black History Month: The Roots of a Celebration



It's a misconception that Black History Month has only been around since its official designation by President Gerald Ford in 1976. Carter G. Woodson, a Harvard-trained historian and the renowned father of black history in America devoted his life toward advocating for visibility, recognition, and appreciation of the black experience and contributions to American history, culture and society. Pursuing these ambitions, Woodson laid the foundations for Negro History Week (NHW) in 1925. The

event was first celebrated in February 1926 and was to coincide with the birthdays of Abraham Lincoln and Frederick Douglass.

Although NHW launched a powerful interest in black culture and representation, by the 1960s, during the civil rights movement, the <u>most popular textbook</u> for eighth-grade U.S. history courses only contained mention of two black people in the entirety of events that had transpired since the Civil War. This dearth of representation surrounding black contributions to society in our education system triggered a revolt against the traditional curriculum that eschewed the achievements of the Black Community. Responding to this, several institutions of higher education began advocating for an official <u>Black History Month</u> as a way to realize the ambitions that Woodson had initially fought for decades earlier. On the 50th anniversary of NHW's first celebration, the U.S. officially designated February as Black History Month in 1976, and it has been celebrated each year since then.



## The Jody Town Community

Originally Known as Plant View Subdivison

The Jody Town community grew from the need for housing for "Colored" (Black) civilian employees at Robins Air Force Base during the segregation era. Military bases, constructed as part of the war effort for World War II, brought regional economic advancement and the shift from agriculture to industrialism. Black workers from throughout the Southeast purchased affordable housing in Jody Town, which may have received its name from the African-American blues character, "Joe de Grinder," and the military cadences it inspired. Jody Town became the cultural hub for residents and Black military personnel, with churches, businesses, organizations, and recreation leagues and teams, such as the Warner Robins Jets, which played here at Memorial Park. In the 1970s, urban renewal efforts led to the relocation of residents and demolition of the neighborhood.

In 1941, Milton Scott met and married Frankie Lee Hill, the love of his life. In the 1940's he enlisted into the United States Army. After returning from the Army, he entered vocational school where he received a Certificate of Shoe Repair. In conjunction with his shoe repair certification, he was employed at Robins Air Force Base and retired from civil service in 1979.

He excelled in the marketplace as a successful businessman. Scott's Shoe Shop Repair opened during the late 1940's - early 1950's, setting the path for and was the blueprint for all local black businesses. The building was home to several different businesses, including a Juke Joint and a church.

During the 1960's, Milton Scott opened "Scott's Apartments" in the back lot of his famous Shoe Shop. The apartment buildings were acquired from Robins Air Force Base. When *Jody Town* was sold in 1970, the apartments were closed and Scott's Shoe Shop was relocated to Elberta, Georgia. The Shoe Shop remained open until the early 1980's.


During the late 1960's, Reverend Milton Scott became a Christian Methodist Episcopal Minister and retired January 11, 1991. He transitioned from this life in February, 2005.

Rev. and Mrs. Scott were the parents of the Grove Zone's own, Bro. Abraham Scott.
