It's Almost Here

Where did the time go? School year 2021-2022 is over. We're into summer break. Wasn't it just Christmas?

Senior years for students and parents go very fast. One minute they're the big time senior and suddenly they're green freshmen heading off to college, work, or the military. Don't worry. You've been waiting for this moment since your child was born.

College is so expensive, but not impossible. Hopefully you've set funds aside every month for their education, but if you're like most of us, you waited much too late. So what to do now. Loans are a way to go; however, that is debt, debt, debt for you and them.

- a. If your student wants to attend college but the funds are not available in your account, look elsewhere. Did they qualify for the Hope Scholarship? Look for scholarships online. What is your child's interest? Who in your community is offering small scholarships? What organizations do you belong to that is looking for someone to bless?
- b. There are several colleges right here in Warner Robins. Your student could attend one of them and live at home. Big time Savings!
- c. Did you apply for the Pell Grant? Complete and submit the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). The government offers the Pell Grant to undergraduates with financial need to help them pay for college. The primary factor to get this grant is that you demonstrate financial need. In addition:
- 1) You're seeking an undergraduate degree and haven't already earned another degree.
- 2) You're a graduate student working toward a post-baccalaureate <u>teaching certificate</u>.
- 3) You haven't been incarcerated or involuntarily committed to a mental health unit after incarceration for a sexual offense.
- d. Check into a technical school. The Hope Scholarship pays for technical school as well.

May Re-cap

Adult Sunday School Teachers

Elder Connie Dinkins, Brother Michael White and Minister Arie Freeman, Jr.

During this unit all the lesson will come from II Corinthians. Unit 2 was titled Encouragement from a Tested Servant. Paul is that Trusted Servant and we can learn a great deal from the trials and struggles Paul endured. We get to see how all these lessons relate to us and challenge us to be stead-fast in the face of trials, and tribulations. For the month of May Brother Michael White and Minister Arie Freeman facilitated the lessons. This quarter lessons will be dealing with Training, which is the theme for the quarter.

Unit 2: encouragement from a tested servant:

In this unit we got a firsthand look at the Apostle Paul and how he labored with the Corinthians. Paul was committed to bringing the Good News of Jesus Christ no matter the cost. Paul, whose birth name was Saul from the tribe of Benjamin. He was named after Israel first king, King Saul, also from the tribe of Benjamin. He was Jewish and a citizen of Rome. He was a Pharisee and highly educated in Jewish law. Saul was a participant is the stoning of Stephen, the first Christian martyr. He was the chief persecutor of the Way, which is what the early Christian were called. While on his journey to persecute Christian, he was confronted by Jesus on the Damascus Road and was blinded by the light. He was led to Ananias who restored his sight. Saul was baptized and became a follower of Jesus. Jesus' disciples were at first skeptical of Paul because of his earlier action. He made countless trips across the Mediterranean preaching Jesus, The Good News. He became the Apostle to the Gentiles, spending over 30 years traveling, ministering the Word, and starting churches. Paul is credited with being the author of 14 of the 27 books in the New Testament. Paul suffered greatly after his conversion. He was beaten and stoned several times. Spent time in various prison. Paul, a persecutor of Christians became their Greatest Ambassador.

Lesson 9: Glory of the New Covenant; Lesson 10: Our Heavenly Dwelling; Lesson 11: Ambassadors for Christ: Lesson 12: Spiritual Weapons; and lastly Lesson 12: Paul's Thorn in the Flesh. We live our lives in a world from day to day without ant thoughts for eternity. We have gotten to a point where we think tomorrow is a given. Everything is going well. Family is fine, all bills are paid, and food is abundant. Suddenly, health gets bad, and disaster strike. Death comes knocking at your door. This earthly body dies daily. Every day we are getting closer to meet our maker. Death has a way of putting things in proper perspective. This world is not our home. It is our temporary dwelling place. Jesus told us "I go to prepare a place for you and where I am there you shall be also. We have an eternal dwelling place. Our Heavenly Dwelling is in New Jerusalem. Revelation 21 speaks of The New Jerusalem as the holy city, coming down from God out of heaven like a bride. We are grateful that the pain of this world is temporary. As an Ambassador a person is sent as a Chief Representative of his state, country, or government. The Ambassador is the messenger who has been given authority to speak for the government or state, not for himself. As Ambassadors for Christ, we have a responsibility to represent Him to the world in all we do. Not just with words. Paul, who is an Ambassador for Christ tell us in Romans 5 that we must let the world know that Christ died for everyone, and salvation is for everyone. God has reconciled us to Himself and there is no barrier. When Jesus died on the Cross, the veil was ripped, and we can now come boldly through the works of Christ.

Christ is the one who brought us back to God. Our life in Christ should be an example to the world that we are indeed an ambassador. Paul's Thorn in the Flesh was given to humble him. No one knows sure what Paul's thorn was. We know this thorn caused Paul pain. God allowed Satan to afflict Paul, just as He allowed Satan to afflict Job. Paul said this thorn tormented him and kept him humbled. Paul pleaded with God on three (3) separate occasion to have the thorn removed. Jesus also prayed three (3) times in the Garden of Gethsemane for relief. However, God responded by telling Paul "His Grace is sufficient for him". Paul was forced on several occasions to defend his authority and ministry. Many false teachers claimed to have more authority and they were better speakers. They boasted often of their credentials. Paul refused to boast about his credentials but had no problem boasting of his weakest and how God sustain him. Paul got something better than relief from his thorn. He received God's Grace. We may not get what we ask for or want, but God will give us what we need. 2 Peter 2:9 tells us "God knows how to rescue godly people from their trials while punishing the wicked and evil right up until the Day of Judgment.

In June we start the summer quarter with the theme: <u>Servants and Healers</u>. We will discuss servants who served Faithfully, prophets who faithfully prophesied, and servants who faithfully healed.

My prayer is for God to continue to bless this ministry as we strive to share the Good News of Jesus Christ our Lord and Savior?






