

\sim The Importance of Mid-Term Elections \sim

Mid-term elections are important because they help determine power in Congress. As stated in the Constitution, Congress is a legislative body that has the authority to make laws. As a bill only becomes law with approval from both the House and the Senate, the political party with the majority in both chambers of Congress is more likely to have their legislation passed. This is especially important when it comes to bills that impact a lot of people, like those that would protect data privacy or secure voting rights.

Mid-term elections are important because they provide voters with the opportunity to change the party in power. Fifty-one seats are required for a political party to have control in the Senate, while <u>218 are needed</u> to achieve a majority in the House. There are currently <u>11,831 bills and resolutions</u> before Congress. In the 117th Congress, there have been 309 <u>bills and joint resolutions that have become laws</u> with a Democratic majority.
























I Cor. 12:1, 28 – Now concerning spiritual gifts ...And God have set some in the church, first apostles, secondarily prophets, thirdly teachers ...

Adult Sunday School Teachers

Elder Connie Dinkins, Minister Arie Freeman Jr., and Brother Michael White

For the month of July, we were in Unit II of the Summer Quarter dealing with the topic Faithful to Prophesy. During this unit we were still in Old Testament books and examining the faith of the prophets Haggai, Micah, Habakkuk, and Ezekiel. We got to see how God used these men to deliver His message. We get to see their ministry although different, but effective in spreading the news. We find prophecy of repentance and rebuke as well as hope in times of despair. While Haggai, Micah, and Ezekiel spoke and prophesied to the people, Habakkuk dialogued with God about current and future events. For the month of July, Brother Michael White and Minister Arie Freeman facilitated the lessons. This quarter's lessons are still dealing with the overarching theme: Servants and Healers.

Unit 2: Faithful to Prophesy:

In this unit we got a firsthand look The lessons of Unit II were Lesson 1: Haggai Calls for Faithful Service; Lesson 2: Micah Stands Firm for God; Lesson 3: Habakkuk Praises God's Faithfulness; Lesson 4: Ezekiel Brings Hope to Israel, and lastly Lesson 5: Jesus Heals a Centurion's Servant.

Lesson 1: Haggai Calls for Faithful Service: The Book of Haggai is a short book, only two (2) chapters. Haggai lived in Jerusalem after the return of the Jewish from exile in Babylon. He was there as they began rebuilding the Temple. When opposition arose and the work stopped, Haggai began campaigning for the work to resume and be completed. God gave Haggai a message for Zerubbabel, the high priest. You're back home in Judah. You've rebuilt your houses and garden, but my house (Temple) is desolated, lying in ruins. You are happy and content in your house while mine lay in ruins. I am not happy. You could be doing much better if you were obedient. Now get busy. Get to work. Get the lumber, the timber and rebuild my house. If you don't this will happen. I will call for a drought because of your disobedience to rebuild the Temple. The people heard and obeyed the message from Haggai. God lit a fire in Zerubbabel and the rest of the people, and they began working on the temple. Pt. 1: When God gives you and assignment, He expect you to complete it. Pt. 2: There are always consequences for any decision you make. Pt. 3: Don't let fear or opposition keep you from your assigned task.

Lesson 2: Micah Stands Firm for God: Micah was a small -town prophet. He was a prophet during the times of Isaiah, and Hosea. Micah's message was to people who abused power and privilege. The rich were getting richer through violence and extortion, judges were easily bribed, and rulers who did whatever it took to stay and power and live in luxury. Sounds like Donald Trump. Micah admonished the Jewish victims for seeking help from idols instead of praying and asking God for help. His purpose was to warn the people that God's judgment is coming, and it was time to repent. This lesson dealt with wealthy oppressors. Chapter 2:3 states "The Lord say I will reward your evil with evil. You will not be able to escape. Your enemies will laugh and make fun of you. The people refused to believe. They did not like what Micah was prophesying. They said no disaster will come upon them. God will not have patience with your behavior. You are doing the poor and weak so wrong. You don't like what I am saying because I am speaking the truth. Your land and home will be taken from you because of you evil and sinful ways. Pt.1: Even when people refuse to hear the truth, continue to tell

the truth. Pt.2: Judgment will come to all for the deeds they have done. Pt.3: God will only be patient for so long and then judgment. Pt.4: Don't be too quick to listen to people who say what you want to hear.

Lesson 3: Habakkuk Praises God's Faithfulness: Habakkuk was a prophet who had questions for God as to why He allows the wicked and evil to go unpunished. He sees evil and sin all around him and he is constantly crying out to God for action. God responds by telling Habakkuk, He is sending the Babylonians to punish the Israelites. Then Habakkuk questions God again. Why are you send them evil cruel Babylonians to wipe us out? We are your people. You want to kill us? Pt. 1 God does not work by our timetable. Habakkuk wants God to react now. God can and will use whomever He chooses to do His work. Even the cruel Babylonians. Pt.2: Living right and being holy does not mean we won't have hardships in this life. Habakkuk goes to the watchtower to wait for God's reply. The watchtower was Habakkuk quiet time with God. Your watchtower or prayer time may be different. God tells Him to write my answer plainly on tablets so there will be no mistakes. And whomever runs with the answer can correctly relay what is to happen. This message is not for now, but the future. It will surely happen. After Habakkuk gets the bison, he sees God in a totally different light. His eyes are open to a Just and Righteous God. Yes, bad things do happen, and we will have trials and tribulations. But as for me I will trust in you. I will rejoice in you. You are my strength and you Pt.3: God is patient and longsuffering with His children, and we must be patient and wait for God's timing. Pt.4: God will never give up on us. We must never give up on God. Pt.5: In spite of our situations we must serve God Faithfully.

Lesson 4: Ezekiel Brings Hope to Israels: Ezekiel was a priest and a prophet. At the age of 25 he was taken captive to Babylon. Five years later he began 22 years of ministry as a prophet. The main point of the Book of Ezekiel is that God will allow invaders to destroy the cities, exile the citizens, but will one day restore the Jewish nation. Some call this chapter the Valley of the Dry Bones. Ezekiel was Israel prophet of Hope. God used the Valley of Dry Bones to communicate a message to Ezekiel which he relayed to the Jews who were in exile in Babylon. Ezekiel was told to prophesy to the bones. These bones were lifeless and dry. God said I will bring them back to life. This was a message for the exile Jews. Yes, your life had been taken from you. You are in a strange land with no Hope. I will not forget you. I will bring you back to life. You will survive and live. Ezekiel did as God told him and prophesied to the bones and they came alive and breathed and was an exceedingly great army. God said "What I did for these bones I'll do for Israel. The nation will live again. God's final words on the matter was this "I am the Lord; I have spoken it and I've made it happen." (1.) God can chose to speak to you through whatever means necessary. (2.) God is the giver of life. (3.) There are no limitations with God. (4.) God will restore and redeem His children. (5.) God is faithful to His people and His promise.

Lesson 5: Jesus Heals a Centurion Servant: Jesus is a healer. He had healed many from diseases and evil vexed spirits. Jesus had just finished ministering and teaching about love for enemies and his declaration in the Sermon on the mount (The Beatitudes), Teaching about the Golden Rule, judging others, love, money, and prayer. Even though he had a lot of fellow Jews wishing to do Him harm. The first outline, Evidence of Goodness, expresses a lot about the Centurion's faith and belief. Here is a Gentile who has heard and possible seen the miracle Jesus performed. From what he observed himself, he saw the goodness and authority of Jesus. He may not have been a believer, but it did take much to act on what he saw and what he needed. Jesus was sent for and was on his way to the Centurion's home when He got the word not to come. The Centurion felt he was not of Jesus coming to his home. However, if you say the word my servant will be healed. Evidently, this Centurion knew something about authority, and he exercised his belief. That's what faith is. Exercising one's belief. When Jesus heard what was said he marveled and said to the people gathered that He had not seen so great of faith in all of Israel. When the messenger returned to the Centurion's home, he found the servant healed. (1.) The way you live your life can welcome people or turn them away. (2.) The Lord can do exceptional things. (3.) Everyone is worthy in the eyesight of God. (4.) Jesus is a true test that all authority is in Him.

In August we will continue with Unit III of the summer quarter with the topic: Faithful to Heal. We will discuss the miraculous healing through Faith. My prayer is for God to continue to bless this ministry as we strive to share the Good News of Jesus Christ our Lord and Savior?

School has started! I know you have already bought some back-to-school clothes. I hope you didn't buy their entire fall wardrobe at once. Yes, our children have grown over the summer, but it's still hot, so summer clothes can

still be worn. Check clearance racks for summer items. Also, I saw a news report that clothing racks are running over as the shipping containers that were stuck at the docks are now being unloaded and retail backorders are coming in along with fall orders. The stores don't have room to store all this merchandise, so they will be forced to put some of it on sale.

NET WORTH. I started discussing this topic back in 2019 and I'm still on it. By 2050, the average new worth of African Americans will be **ZERO**. Why? We won't own anything or extraordinarily little. New worth is the difference between what you own (minus your residence) and what you owe. Can this trend be reversed? **OF COURSE!** But not on its own. We must all work together to help one another get ahead and stay ahead. What can we do?

- a) Invest in stocks and bonds.
- b) Invest in land.
- c) Open our own businesses. Run them in a professional manner. Sometimes we don't support our own because one Black person didn't do us right or did a poor job. How many white shop owners have done us wrong and yet we keep going back? Shop around.
- d) Support other Black-owned businesses. The reason there are so few Black-owned businesses is that we stopped supporting them and whites never have. You must look for them. We were so happy the chain restaurants and retail stores let us shop that we forgot about the shops that were available to us all the time.
- e) Check on your family's heir property. Call your cousin, aunt, whomever to see who is looking after things, i.e. paying taxes, and maintaining the property.
- f) Pay your property taxes on time. Once our mortgages are paid off, it gets easy to forget about the insurance and taxes. Set up your own escrow account so you won't get caught with an unexpected tax bill/insurance bill.
