



June Re-cap

I Cor. 12:1, 28 - Now concerning spiritual gifts ...And God have set some in the church, first apostles, secondarily prophets, thirdly teachers ...

Elder Connie Dinkins, Minister Arie Freeman Jr., and Brother Michael White

For the month of June, we started the Summer Quarter. The quarter has three units; Unit I: Faithful to Serve, Unit II: Faithful to Prophesy; and Unit 3: Faithful to Heal. During the first unit for the month of June will were in Old Testament books and examined the faith of Samuel, Isaiah, Asaph, Haggai, and Zechariah. Unit 1 was titled Faithful to Serve. We got to see how God used these faithful men to serve His people. For the month of June Elder Connie Dinkins, Brother Michael White and Minister Arie Freeman facilitated the lessons. This quarter lessons will be dealing with theme: Servants and Healers.

Unit 1: Faithful to Serve:

In this unit we will see firsthand how God use people who are willing and faithful to serve Him. We will see how Samuel was called at an early age to serve, Isaiah was called to serve after seeing a vision of Heaven and god's holiness. A psalmist, Asaph, had to have a change of perspective to fully understand what God is doing, and finally God put it in the hearts of foreign rulers to let the exile return to their homeland and rebuild the nation and the Temple with the encouragement of the prophets Haggai and Zechariah. The lessons of Unit 1 were Samuel's Call and Ministry; Isaiah's Commission; Asaph Laments; and lastly The Service of Godly Leaders.

Lesson 1: Samuel's Call and Ministry: The Lord called Samuel at an early age. Samuel was the son of Elkanah and Hannah. Hannah was barren and was taunted because she had no children. Hannah prayed for a son and promised God she would give the child back to him. God answered her prayer, Samuel was born, and he stayed with Hannah until he was weaned. After Samuel was weaned Hannah and Elkanah took Samuel to the Temple after the animal sacrifice, they left him with Eli, the Priest. Samuel served the Lord by assisting Eli, the priest who was almost blind. Three (3) times God called Samuel while he was asleep. Each time Samuel responded Here I am and went to Eli for he thought it was Eli calling him. After the third time Eli to Samuel, "If you get called again say "Speak Lord, your servant is listening. God called Samuel again and told him all the things that would happen to Eli's sons because of their evil. Samuel was reluctant to tell Eli, but Eli pressured him, and he was finally told. Samuel grew and all Israel knew Samuel was to be a prophet of the Lord. Pt.1: You are never too young or too old to be called by God. God can use you regardless of your age and experience. He will give you what you need to carry out His instructions. While Samuel was still a child, Israel was defeated in a war with the Philistines and the Ark of the Covenant was taken from Shiloh. The Ark caused the Philistine so much trouble they sent it back. For 20 years the Ark was in Kiriath-jearim and the people mourned because they feared the Lord had abandon them. Pt. 2: God never left the people. He patiently waited for them to get their act together. Samuel ministered to the people in their despair. Telling them to put away the idols and turn back to the Lord and God will deliver you from the Philistines. So, they did as they were told and served the Lord only. The Philistine heard what had happen and was going to attack. The people urged Samuel to continue to reach out to God on their behalf. Samuel prayed and God answered Samuel prayer and the Israelites smote the Philistines. Samuel built an altar and called it Eben-ezer which means 'The Lord helped us'. Pt. 3: When you forsake the Lord and do the things God detest, you can expect turmoil and disaster. When you repent you are turning away from the things God detest and turning toward God. Learn to listen and know the voice of God. He is an ever present help in all times.

Lesson 2: Isaiah's Commission:

It is interesting that the opening statement of the lesson starts with in the year of the king's death. It was in this year of King Uzziah's death that Isaiah saw the Lord. What was the connection between the year of the king's death and Isaiah vision? Uzziah was a good king, scripture tell us he did what was pleasing to the Lord. However, after his death, his son, Zechariah became king, and he did evil in the Lord's sight. God was going to use Isaiah as His messenger to Judah to call

the people back to God and to tell of God's plan for salvation through His son, Jesus Christ. Pt.1: God always has a ram in the bush. He knows ahead of time what must be done. God is always working.

The vision that Isaiah saw was very majestic. The vision displayed the holiness of God, sitting on His throne surrounded by winged seraphims (angels). Isaiah had gotten a glimpse into heaven. The angels proclaimed the glory of God with the words Holy, Holy, Holy. The whole world is filled with God's glory. It was an awesome scene. Isaiah feels his life is over because he has seen the Lord and is not worthy. Instead, God purifies Isaiah, removes his guilt and his sins are forgiven. Pt. 2: Being in God's presence and seeing His glory and holiness make us realize just how unworthy we are. After the purification, a request was made in the form of a question, "Who shall I send to Judah, who will go". Isaiah responded, "Here I am, send me". Isaiah goes with a message to the people. It is a harsh message for the people. The people had perverted themselves to the point that they refused to hear and obey. Isaiah asked how long this will go on. God response was until their towns are empty and their houses deserted. Pt.3: God is always willing and ready to forgive us when we are truly repentant. Pt.4: We all have an obligation to respond to a call to service. After Isaiah was cleansed from his sins, he was ready to be used by God. As we learn more about God and His holiness, we grow in earnest eagerness to serve Him.

Lesson 3: Asaph Laments: We all at some point struggle with doubt and despair when we see all that is happening in the world. It seems the evil and wick keep doing what they are doing with punishment and the righteous and those trying to live righteous are struggling just to get by. It just doesn't seem fair. God, where are you. That was Asaph dilemma. He was looking at things from a world perspective and expecting a right now solution. Pt. 1 God does not work by our timetable. Asaph begin feeling what the use in living Holy and doing right. Pt. 2 Living right and being holy does not mean we won't have hardships in this life. We must serve God regardless of life situations. Asaph got a clearer understanding when he spent time in God's presence. When Asaph was in the Temple, God gave him understanding as to what will happen. Pt. 3 God is patient and longsuffering with His children, and we must have a divine perspective of God's actions. God showed Asaph the wicked will have their day of judgment and there will be no escape. Psalms 36:12 tell us 'The workers of iniquity will be cast down and shall not be able to rise.' The holy Spirit will lead and guide us. When we rely on our own intellect, we act foolish and ignorant. Pt.4 But God does not give up on us for He said "I will never leave you, nor forsake you. Asaph came to understand just as we must understand that God will never stop leading and guiding us. Our job is to follow His leading. Stay in fellowship with God. He is the source of our strength. He keeps the inner man secure and strengthen the spirit to persevere and endure. Just like Asaph, we know God is good. But when our flesh and heart grow weak and weary, we must cling to the hope we have in Christ Jesus. Pt.5 In spite of our situation, we must serve God Faithfully.

Lesson 4: The Service of Godly Leaders: The children has been in exile and King Cyrus made a proclamation allowing them to return to their homeland. God stirred the hearts of the priests and Levites and leaders of the tribe of Judah and Benjamin to go to Jerusalem to rebuild the temple. This first group of exiles with Zerubbabel quickly rebuilt the Temple but soon was met with criticisms by their enemies who opposed the rebuilding. People tried to discourage and frighten them to keep them from working. Construction finally was halted for sixteen years. Pt. 1: When you are trying to do the work of the Lord, not everyone will be happy. Some will do whatever they can to discourage, disrupt, and delay what you are doing. The rebuilding started under King Cyrus, now there is a change in ruler, Darius is now King. Darius had them search the Babylonian archives, they found the memorandum dating back to King Nebuchadnezzar and he issued a decree for the Temple to be rebuilt and that none of the worker shall be hindered. The work was restarted, and the people were encouraged by the prophets Haggai and Zechariah. The Temple was finally completed and dedicated with great joy. The priests and Levites resumed their duties and celebrated Passover in the Temple. God used foreign kings and rulers, to give the Jewish people a fresh start. After years of delay they were given the chance to complete the Temple and rebuild their nation on godly principles. Pt.2: God can and will use anyone to do His will.

In July we start the Unit II of the summer quarter with the topic: Faithful to Prophesy. We will discuss the prophecies of Haggai, Micah, Habakkuk, and Ezekiel. Servants who message of repentance and rebuke warned and prepared the people that God will indeed fulfill His promise.

My prayer is for God to continue to bless this ministry as we strive to share the Good News of Jesus Christ our Lord and Savior?








































Healthcare Ministry would like to thank everyone that donated reading glasses to members and the community. We thank you for your support, we're sure they are a great help to those that needed them.

We all know that exercise is key to staying young and warding off diseases. Wrong types of exercises age you faster and make you more vulnerable to heart diseases, diabetes, and cancer. Some exercises can accelerate how fast you appear to be aging while running your health others can help you look and feel younger. We know covid hasn't gone away, plus there's a new one called monkey pox. It starts with cold-like symptoms. It can spread when there is close contact with lesions of someone who is infected and it looks like sexual contact that speeded in central and western Africa where people are infected by animals like wild rodents and primates with the out breaks across borders (WHO) World Health Organization has recorded 90 cases of monkey pox in dozens of countries including Britain, Spain, Israel, France, Switzerland, United States and Australia. These are ongoing epidemics. Monkey pox can cause fever, chills, rash and lesions on the face, arms, or genital areas. It can spread through close contact with an infected person, clothing or bed sheets, although sexual transmission has not yet been documented. This is not covid, we need to slow it down, be careful, social distance, and continue wearing our masks.

It does not spread in air, there is a vaccine to protect against it. Take precautions and stay safe to protect yourself. Let's take care of our temples so God can use us. Here are a few of my favorite Bible verses: John 3:16, Jeremiah 29:11, Roman 8:28, Philippians 4:13, Genesis 1:1, Proverb 3:5, 3:6, Roman 12:2, Philippians 4:6, Matthew 28:19. What are some of your favorite scriptures? Pray about them, reflect on them when you need encouragement and ask the Holy Spirit to guide you so these can be meaningful and helpful in your life. You can experience many blessings if you have bible reading habits. We use worship as a weapon against spiritual attacks. We have put on the full armor of God so we can stand against devil schemes. Our struggles aren't against flesh and blood but against rules, against authority, against power of darkness of world and against spiritual forces of evil in heavenly realms. Let's Get That Bear!


Proverbs 21:5 – The plans of the diligent lead to profit as surely as haste leads to poverty. (NIV)

Wall Street is in a "bear market." That means that stocks have declined at least 20% from their most recent high. They are relatively common. The last one occurred two years ago when the pandemic shuttered most businesses.

If you are invested in the stock market, get scared, and pull your money out, the bear gets you. If you stay the course, or better yet, join the market and invest consistently, you can get the bear. Right now, stock prices are low. Let's **BUY LOW AND SELL HIGH!** Someone always makes money during a recession. It could be you. If you look at the pictorial history of the stock market from its inception, it always recovers.



Two principles I would like to introduce to you:

- a. Dollar Cost Averaging Let's say you decide to spend \$100 per month buying stocks. The stocks cost \$10 per share. The first and second months you can buy 10 shares each month. The third month, the market takes a dive to \$5 per share. With your \$100 investment you can purchase 20 shares each month for the next two months. Now the stock market recovers and shares bounce back to \$10 per share. You've invested \$500, own 70 shares now worth \$700. That's a gain of \$200. You get the bear.
- b. Rull of 72 Divide any interest rate into the number **72**, and you know how many years it will take your money to double. The current interest rates most banks and credit unions in this area are paying is less that 1%. It will take 72 years for your money to double. It will take 72 years for \$5 to become \$10 or \$5,000 to become \$10,000. If you can get an interest rate of 12%, your money doubles every 6 years. Invest **any** amount consistently for 20 years and average 12%, add the zeroes to that amount to know how much you will have. For example, if I invest \$200 each month for 20 years, getting an average return of 12%, I will have \$200,000.

"For God works all things together for good to those who love him and are called according to his purpose." (Roman 8:28).


I believe that we all will love this verse because we all suffer and experience hardships but it's such a blessing to know He got us!


