



September Recap

I Cor. 12:1, 28 – Now concerning spiritual gifts ...And God has set some in the church, first apostles, secondarily prophets, thirdly teachers ...

Adult Sunday School Teachers

Elder Connie Dinkins, Brother Michael White, and Minister Arie Freeman, Jr.

For the month of September, we started the Fall Quarter discussing the theme: Learning to Honor God. This first unit had three lessons from the Book of Exodus. We examined Obedience in Leadership, Obedience to Remember, Promise of Obedience, and Obedience and Respect. Unit 1 was titled Beginning with Obedience. We discussed how God used Moses to teach and instruct the Israelites. For the month of September Brother Michael White and Minister Arie Freeman facilitated the lessons.

Unit 1: Beginning with Obedience: We saw firsthand how God's people began their journey. These lessons discussed the call of Moses while in Midian, the deliverance from Egypt, the Israelites promise of obedience, and lastly how to rightly worship God.

Lesson 1: Obedience in Leadership: While attended the flock of his father-in-law, Jethro, Moses witnessed a bush burning but was not destroyed and he was curious enough to go inspect. Pt.1: Curiosity can lead us into many situations. In this case Moses' curiosity got him in the presence of God. The Lord called Moses from the bush. He warned him not to come closer and to take off his shoes for he was standing on Holy Ground. God introduced himself to Moses and told him He has seen the people's afflictions and has heard their cry, and He knew their sorrow. Pt.2: We serve a Holy God, and we cannot approach Him any kind of way. Pt. 3: God will make Himself know to His people in different ways. God told Moses I am sending you to Pharoah with the instruction to "Let my people go". God is aware of all that has happened and is happening. Moses complained that he was not worthy to go. His statement was "Who am I"? Pt.4: Without God we are nothing and helpless, but with God we can do all things. Moses was correct in his statement, by himself, he is nothing. God assured him that "I will be with you". Pt. 5: When we have God with us and His assurance, we must step out in faith and do what God has called us to do. Learn to listen and follow the voice of God. He is always with us to lead, guide, and protect.

Lesson 2: Obedience to Remember: The Israelites had witnessed all the horrible things that had happened to the Egyptians, and they were not affected. Now God was getting ready to deliver the final plague on the Egyptians. Moses was given instructions from God as to what to tell the Israelites. God was preparing them for their new beginning. This month will be the beginning of a new month and it will become the first month of the year. Abib was the seventh month, but it will now become the first month. The name was changed to Nisan after the Babylonian Captivity. Pt.1: When God moves in our lives, we have a new beginning. Take advantage of the new beginning. The Lord spoke with Moses and Aaron with new instructions. These new instructions all centered around a lamb. Pt.2: Our whole life should be centered around a Lamb, Jesus; The Lamb of God.. The lamb was the betthe center of the meal the Israelites would eat on a particular night, the fourteenth day of Abib. They were to take good care of this lamb. God gave specific instruction about the care of the lamb/goat. It must be a male, one year old, with no defects. On the 14th day, it will be killed. The blood of the lamb has an important purpose. Take the blood and smear it on the side posts and upper post of the houses where you will eat the lamb. Pt.3: Although the instruction might seem strange, we must follow God's instructions as given. Do not add or take away from them. God gave instructions on how to prepare the lamb for eating and how you are to dress for eating the meal. All the instructions were the foundation for the Passover. The blood of the lamb on the door post allowed the death angle to Passover the house. Pt.4: The blood of Jesus is our Passover.

Jesus' blood was shed so that we might be forgiven of our sins. On this night, the first born of every man and beast of Egypt will die. This is God executing His judgment. Pt. 5: The Passover that the Israelites witnessed on this night was the forerunner for what Jesus instituted on the night before He was arrested, The Lord's Supper. We can clearly see that it was all God, and Moses and Aaron were the human instruments God used. We are all instruments to be used by God.


Lesson 3: Promise of Obedience: The Israelites had been on their journey from Egypt for three months when they arrived at the desert of Mount Sanai and setup camp. This was a strange place for the Israelites, but Moses knew all about this place. He had spent 40 years there. Pt.1: God knows we will get tired and need rest. This is a time for rest and the get better organized. Moses went up the mountain and God spoke to him and gave him new instructions for the Israelites. Moses was to tell the people to remember all that God had done to the Egyptians and how He had been their refuge all this time. If you will obey me and keep my covenant you will be a special people to me above all others. Not only will you be special people you will be a kingdom of priest and a Holy nation. Pt.2: God instruction to Moses for the people were that they would be rewarded for their obedience. Obedience is better than sacrifice. Moses told the people all that God had said, and all the people responded, "we will do everything that the Lord has commanded". Pt.3: When you make a pledge to obey God, God holds you accountable. Making a pledge or vow is more than just having good intentions. Stay true to what you say. Moses told them all the judgments, ordinances, and commandments they were to adhere to. Pt.4: It is better not to make a vow than to make a vow and not fulfill it. Moses wrote down all the words of the Lord and built an altar to seal the vow that was made. Moses appointed young men to perform sacrifices and setup twelve stone pillars representing each tribe. Moses performed a binding sacrifice before God and the people. He again read the covenant to the people and again the responded "We will do all that the Lord has commanded". Moses sprinkled blood from the sacrifice on the people signifying the sealing of the vow. Pt. 5: The blood of the lamb sealed their covenant just as the Blood of Jesus sealed our covenant with God. We are called to honor and obey all that God has commanded.

Lesson 4: Obedience and Respect: This lesson is a continuation of Chapter 19 from lesson 3. The Israelites were presented with a show of God's awesomeness early in the morning. God roared from Mount Sanai with thunder, lightning, and a thick cloud of smoke, and all the people trembled. God had gotten their attention. Pt.1: God knows what it takes to get our attention. It may take an extreme shock for some of us. God will always do what needs to be done. God will show His Glory and power in various ways. All the people assembled at the base of the mountain. When the trumpet sounded long and louder, Moses spoke, and God answered. God called Moses to come up the mountain. Pt.2: When God gets ready, He will call us. We must be ready to heed the call. As soon as Moses got up the mountain, God sent him back down to warn the people not to try and come up. Moses had been instructed to sat boundaries around the mountain so the people would not try and go up themselves. Pt.3: God doesn't want any of us to perish, so He gives us warnings. Even though Moses had set boundaries and warned the people, God sent him back down to remind them not to come up. Pt.4: We are curious people, and we will overlook what we have been told because we want to see for ourselves. Curiosity will get us in a lot of trouble. Moses said to God, "I have set boundaries and warned the people. They know not to come up". God told Moses to go back down and bring Aaron with you. But let no priest, elder or anyone else come up. Pt.5: We must be certain to obey all that God has said to avoid punishment. God instructions to us are to be obeyed and respected.

In October we will continue in Unit II, Obedience in Worship.



We Made It to Fall!

We made it to October and the cooler weather! Time to pull out those light jackets for the morning but keep our t-shirts for the afternoons.

Open season for Medicare starts October 15th and ends December 7th. Medicare is health insurance for: • People 65 or older • Certain people under sixty-five with disabilities • People of any age with End-Stage Renal Disease (ESRD) (permanent kidney failure requiring dialysis or a kidney transplant)

If you will be turning sixty-five in the next few months, you have been bombarded with numerous calls and mailings offering assistance with your Medicare plan. It can be overwhelming. It's difficult to know what your needs will be in the future. Life can change in an instant. Medicare has several parts.

- a. Part A covers hospitalization (Mandatory at age 65) and is provided at no charge if you paid into the Medicare system while you were working.
- b. Part B covers doctors and other health care. Most people pay the standard Part B premium amount.
- c. Part C is an "all in one" alternative to Original Medicare. These "bundled" plans include Part A, Part B, and usually Part D. Plans may have lower out-of-pocket costs than Original Medicare. Most plans offer extra benefits that Original Medicare doesn't cover—like vision, hearing, and dental services.
- d. Part D covers the cost of prescription drugs (including recommended shots or vaccines) Run by private insurance companies that follow rules set by Medicare May help lower your drug costs and help protect against higher costs in the future.

You can change your enrollment in Medicare health and drug plans during this time. Things to consider:

- a. What are my general healthcare needs?
- b. What medication, if any, am I on consistently?
- c. What have my out-of-pocket expenses been this year?
- d. What's available next year?
- e. If I'm still working, do I need to enroll in Medicare. Should I stay covered by my employer's plan?

Now is a suitable time to get a copy of your credit report from **Annualcreditreport.com**. You can get one free once a year from either Equifax, Experian, or TransUnion. If you use a different website, you may have to pay. Other sites sell your information.

SCAM ALERT: If you get a call asking if you got your new Medicare Card, simply hang up. It's a fraud. This is someone trying to get your Medicare number. When you get your statements letting you know what Medicare has paid, be sure to check them. If you don't recognize a doctor or service provider, check it out.





The cost is \$45.00 per person due at time they enter the training. Our monthly meetings are on second Thursday night of each month at the Church in the Healthcare room. We will continue to take temperatures and pass out masks if you don't have one but it's still mandatory that everyone wears a mask as they enter the building. Covid is not gone anywhere and the pandemic isn't over so let's keep our bodies protected so we can serve and worship the Lord like we should. We must be willing to work while we can, God wants us to help others, don't be ashamed to use your gifts. We need you so come join our ministry team it's rewarding in helping God's people. We attend Mental Healthcare seminars that help us to help others like care givers conferences, Diabetes, healthy eating, Hospice and the Pink Cancer seminars. We even get credits from some of these seminars that can help you in your career if you are still employed not to mention the free meals and great speakers we get to listen to.

Don't forget to get your flu, shingle and new covid booster in October. There are new viruses out there. The FDA says shots are safe and they fend off diseases and new variants that are found in BA.4 and BA.5 that are circulating today. So let's protect our immune systems. Don't forget to

protect your children since they're back in school in person. We don't worry about what the year will hold for them, so let's be healthy so they can learn all they can and enjoy playing sports and whatever their dreams are. Let's help them to grow with opportunity of fulfilling their life dreams and feeling free from getting sick. Don't forget to love and nuture their friendships with others. Stay in tune in what's happening in their classrooms and school activities. Don't forget listen and have discussions with your children. Help your kids in their daily tasks so they will feel comfortable talking to you about anything, this will help develop strategies and thoughts for positive self-talk and avoid negative thoughts.

Anaphylaxis is a serious allergic reaction. It comes quickly and can be fatal. Medicine used to treat anaphylaxis is epinephrine given by an injection whenever you eat something you're allergic to. Best place to inject is in muscle or outer part of thigh. If symptoms don't improve, give injection again 5-30 minutes, they are available in two different doses based on weight of person. You should always have at least two doses with you at all times. School age children needs one at school and one at home with instructions from doctor about how and when to use it. Symptoms are on skin itching, hives, redness, swelling, nose sneezing, stuffy or nose running, mouth itching, swollen lips/tongues, throat itching, tightness, difficult swallowing hoarseness, chest shortness of breath. Coughing, wheezing, weak pulse, passing out, vomiting, diarrhea, cramps, neurologic, dizziness, fainting, feeling like you are about to die are few. Most common allergies can trigger anaphylaxis are foods such as peanuts, nuts from trees, shellfish, milk, eggs, strawberries, insect bites, bees, wasps, hornets, yellow jackets, and fire ants. Medicines, antibiotics and antiseizure meds are more common that causes it, even aspirins and other severe non-steroids, anti-inflammatory drugs can cause reactions so learn what foods or insects you are allergic to. It can save your life. Remember to give thanks to God if you have no allergies.

- 2. Give God a heartfelt thank you Lord, declare His greatness.
- 3. Pray unto the Father, the Lord Jesus Christ, the Three in One. Tell Him all about what you are going through and surrender your will to Him.
- 4. Adore Him...Praise Him, Embrace Him; I praise you Lord.
- 5. Acknowledge your dependence for Him, to provide provision, pardon me and for protection and forgives all my sins.
- 6. "Thank you Lord for three meals, the food you gave today."
- 7. "Lord, lead us not into temptation, guide us along the way, lead us to love one another, and our enemies and pray for them."
- 8. "Jesus, I/we ask to let these things bring you joy, bring us joy. Jesus, let the things that break your heart, break ours."
- 9. "Jesus, give us courage to follow you and lead others to you, Lord."
- 10. "Jesus, help us to hear your voice so that we don't build a temple to God, what doesn't exist."
- 11. "Jesus, help us see as you see so we can respond to others in a way that honors you, Lord."

"Father, I want to know your ways; Father, I want to serve you."

God is our Father, Jesus is our Savior, the Holy Spirit is our Guiding Helper and Heaven is our Home.

 Georgia offers <u>online voter registration</u>. You can register by mail to vote in Georgia by printing a voter registration form, filling it out, and mailing it to your local election office.

You can also register to vote in person if you prefer.

Who can register to vote?

- •To register in Georgia, you must: be a citizen of the United States
- •be a legal resident of Georgia and of the county in which you want to vote
- •be at least 17-1/2 years old (you must be 18 to vote)
- •not be serving a sentence for conviction of a felony involving moral turpitude
- •not have been judicially determined to be mentally incompetent, unless the disability has been removed
