Jewish Calendar and Week Days

The Jewish Calendar is a lunisolar calendar. The Jewish calendar is based on the moon phases and has twelve months with 29 or 30 days. Each month begins with the crescent moon when the first sliver of moon is visible after the dark New Moon. The Jewish calendar counts the time from 3761 B C., the date for the creation of the World and the Universe, according to the Bible. In Exodus, God established that Nissan should be the first month of the Jewish calendar.

The United States uses the Gregorian Calendar which is also a solar calendar. It is based on the movement of the Earth around the sun.

Ivar (29 days): April - May
Sivan (30 days): May – June
Tammuz (29 days): June – July
Av (30 days): July - Aug
Elul (29 days): August – September
Tishrel (30 days): September – October

Kislev (29 days): November – December
Tevet (29 days): December – January
Shevat (30 days): January – February
Adar (29 days, 30 days on a leap year): February - March

For the month of August, we were in Unit III of the Summer Quarter dealing with the topic **Faithful to Heal**. During this unit we will still be in New Testament books examining the miraculous heal by faith. Unit 3 was titled **Faithful to Heal**. We got to see how God used these men to deliver His message. For the month of August, Brother Michael White, Minister Arie Freeman, and Elder Connie Dinkins facilitated the lessons. This quarter's lessons are still dealing with the theme: **Servants and Healers**.

Unit 3: Faithful to Heal:

The Lessons of Unit 3 are **Lesson 1: Jesus Heals Two Demoniacs; Lesson 2: A Lame Man is Healed; Lesson 3: Ananias Heals Saul, and lastly Lesson 4: Miracles of Malta**

Lesson 1: Jesus Heals Two Demoniacs; This lesson had two outlines; Jesus' authority over the seas and Jesus' authority over Satan. Authority speaks of control and the power to give orders. Jesus had been casting out evil spirit from demon possessed people and healing the sick. The crowd was growing larger, so Jesus instructed the disciples to cross to the other side of the lake. A fierce storm suddenly arose with mighty waves and the disciples were fearful. Jesus was asleep so they woke him up shouting we're going to drown. Jesus responded, “Why are you afraid”. He then rebukes the wind and the sea and everything became calm. The disciples were amazed and exclaimed “What manner of man is this that even the wind and sea obey Him”. **Pt. (1):** Jesus has complete control over all things. **Pt. (2):** There is no reason to fear when you have Jesus. When they got to the other side, Jesus met two possessed men at a cemetery. They were very fierce, so no one ever came through there. They immediately recognized Jesus and told him “It is not time for you. There was a herd of pigs nearby, so the demon-possessed men said if you are going to cast us out let us go into the pigs. They did and the whole herd of pigs ran off the cliff killing themselves. e. **Pt. (3):** Even the demon recognizes Jesus and must obey. **Pt. (4):** No matter what we face, we can always look to Jesus in faith.

Lesson 2: A Lame Man is Healed: This lesson focuses on the healing of a crippled man by the disciple Peter. After Jesus was taken away into Heaven, his last words to the disciples were to stay in Jerusalem for the receiving of the Holy Spirit. This happened on the Day of Pentecost. All the believers were meeting, and they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began speaking in other languages. Peter addressed the crowd as to what had happened, and they asked what must we do? Peter told them to repent of their sins and turn to God. On that day about 3,000 souls were added to the church.

As Peter and John were on their way to the Temple, they saw a crippled man who was carried each day to the Temple to beg. He asked for alms from Peter and John. Peter told the man to look at him. This was to get his undivided attention. Peter told him I have no money, but I'll give you what I have. In the name of Jesus Christ of Nazarene rise up and walk. Peter helped the man to his feet and his feet and ankles were instantly healed. The man began walking, leaping and praising God. All the people saw what had happened and were amazed. Peter now had an audience and he preached to the people about who was responsible for this miracle, Jesus. The one you had killed even when Pilate wanted to release him. It was through faith in the name of Jesus that this man was healed. **Pt. (1.)** Peter was doing what Jesus had commissioned the disciples to do. **Pt. (2.)** God will provide opportunities for us to use the gifts he has given us. **Pt. (3.)** We must not take credit for what God has done.

Lesson 3: Ananias Heals Saul: Saul was on a mission to arrest and imprison any Christian Jews in Damascus. But God had other plans. **Pt. 1 God can use anyone to do his work.** Saul was on a mission to imprison the Christian Jews, but God had other plans for him. **Pt. 2 We may not understand all that God is doing, but we must obey.** Ananias had heard all the news about Saul, and now he is being told to go and heal him. **Pt. 3 God will always prepare us for what He has called us to do.** Yes, Ananias was afraid, but after God showed him what His plans were for Saul, Ananias obeyed and was not afraid. God showed Asaph the. **Pt.4 We must be willing to always help others.** We may not know who God is placing in our lives. We have been called to be servants for Him. **Pt.5 God will call you for a task even if you did not volunteer.** In spite of our situation, we must serve God faithfully.

Lesson 4: Miracles at Malta: The Apostle Paul had endured various trials and attempts on his life. After appearing before the Jewish Council, Governor Felix, Governor Fetus and King Agrippa, Paul was now on a ship headed to Rome. He would encounter many more trials and potential disasters on this voyage. Caught in a horrific storm at sea and eventually shipwrecked. This is where the lesson picks up. Once that got on shore of an island in Malta after the wreck, they were cold, and it was raining. Paul helped to gather wood to build a fire. **Pt. (1)** When there was work to be done Paul pitched in. He was s servant. When a poisonous snake bit Paul on the hand and held on, he shook it off because of his faith in God. The people thought for sure Paul would die and this was his punishment, and he would never get to Rome. Nothing ever happened to Paul. No swelling or sickness from the snake bite. The people decided Paul was a god. **Pt. (2)** When God has something for you to do nothing can stop it. The Chief official of the island father was ill, Paul prayed for him, and he was healed. As a result, other sick individuals from the island came and were healed. **Pt. (3)** Paul showed kindness and hospitality to all. **Pt. (4)** We must treat all people with the love of Christ regardless of race, creed, or color. When it was time to depart for Rome, Paul was supplied with everything he would need for the journey.

In September, we will start the Fall Quarter with topics dealing with Obedience from the theme **Learning to Honor God.** We will be discussing the first unit from the topic: **Beginning with Obedience.** The lessons are Obedience in Leadership, Obedience to Remember, Promise of Obedience, and Obedience and Respect all from the Book of Exodus.

My prayer is that God will continue to bless this ministry as we strive to share the Good News of Jesus Christ our Lord and Savior.

August was awareness month. Medicare. The Governor advised us to stay up to date on our vaccines. It's important because vaccines protect us against serious illness and can even keep us out of the hospital. Talk with your doctors about which vaccines may be right for you. Medicare covers many of these, covid 19, booster shots, including getting recommended boosters when eligible to keep you protected from secure covid 19 illness, one flu shot per flu season, The CDC recommends getting flu shots by the end of October to stay protected throughout the flu season, two pneumococcal shots. Medicare covers first shot at any time and different second shot if it is given at least one year after first shot. You can visit medicare.gov to see what other vaccines are covered and talk with your doctor about staying up to date on your vaccines.

Monkeypox is serious, it is much less contagious than covid, good news is that we already know a lot about it since it has been around for decades. Taking precautions to avoid covid is masking, social distance, practicing good hand washing are excellent chances to be well protected from monkeypox. (WHO) World Health Organization elevated monkeypox to global health emergency. Monkey pox is a virus that's related to smallpox and symptoms are similar and mild causing a pimple or blister like rash that might appear on face, inside mouth, on hands, feet, chest, genital or anus. Pimples and blisters may be very painful, but not always the case. Other symptoms include fever, headaches, muscle aches, and swollen lymph nodes. Monkeypox was first discovered in 1958; it wasn't documented in humans until 1970. It mostly impacted people in central/western Africa including those who had traveled or had contact with animals that they cared for. In my 226 cases of monkeypox spread thru 21 countries, late July there are more than 4000 cases in the United States, Germany, Spain, France, and the United Kingdom. Experts noted that monkeypox has been diagnosed in men who have sex with men. It's not considered a sexually transmitted infection because at this time it's not known whether it is spread through semen or vaginal fluids. Intimate contact definitely increases risk of transmission, because of close contact that's involved. Most people get it when they touch an animal or person who has been infected. If you come in contact with rash or scabs of someone, who has it. You can also get it thru contact either respiratory droplets, oral fluids which is most apt to happen if you hug, kiss or have sex with someone who has the virus. Monkeypox can also live on surfaces for up to 15 days. If you touch clothing, towels, beddings, or objects that have been contaminated you could contract the virus. It might be 4-21 days after exposure before you exhibit any symptoms. If you have signs of monkeypox, call or visit your health provider, they will test for blood samples or examine the fluids taken from rash under a microscope.

Attached are some of Healthcare Ministry photos. We are a busy Ministry and still alive. We want to thank Minister Earnestine Thompson and Minister Annie Lester for attending the Caregivers Conference that was held at Houston Pavilion. They also attended MASA updated Seminar that was held at Red Lobster in Macon, Ga. We would like to thank our team members that attended Healthcare's first outing since covid that was at Cheddars Restaurant on August 6th at 4 P.M. Minister Thompson wants to thank God for team members and their support to the Ministry for all they do to help keep us safe and protected from any illness. Thanks for all the donations that were presented to our ministry. Keep up the good work. We love each of you, continue to pray for our sick and shut in that God will continue to bless and strengthen them so they will return to church and that "God will send us some more recruits. We would really enjoy having you as part of God's Healthcare Ministry. Lastly, we would like to wish everyone that had a birthday in July and August, a Happy Birthday, we thank God for Blessing you to see another one.
