~ ADULT SUNDAY SCHOOL ~ MARCH RECAP

I Cor. 12:1, 28 – Now concerning spiritual gifts ...And God have set some in the church, first apostles, secondarily prophets, thirdly teachers ...

Adult Sunday School Teachers

Elder Connie Dinkins, Brother Michael White, and Minister Arie Freeman, Jr.

For the month of March, we begin the Spring Quarter dealing with the theme: Jesus Pleases His Father. The quarter has three units; Unit I: By His Works, Unit II: By His Sacrifice, and Unit 3: By His Teachings. The first unit dealt with Jesus' baptism by John the Baptist, Jesus' Temptations in the Wilderness and Doing the works God sent Him to do. For the month of March Brother Michael White and Minister Arie Freeman facilitated the lessons.

Unit 1: By His Works:

In this first unit we see Jesus' baptism in the Jordan River and the witnesses get to hear God's approval. Then right afterward, Jesus is led into the wilderness by the Holy Spirit and is confronted by Satan. And lastly, we see how Jesus always followed the will of His father, God. The three lessons of Unit 1 were Jesus' Baptism, Overcoming Temptation with the Word, and Doing the Father's Word. We wrapped up March with Unit 2, Lesson 1: Submitting to the Father's Will.

Lesson 1: Jesus' Baptism: The lesson was divided into two outlines: The Preparer and The Prepared. John the Baptist was the preparer. He was chosen to point the way. John is the New Testament version of Elijah the prophet, from the Old Testament. John was preaching repentance of sin and water baptism. John was sent to prepare the way for Jesus. He was sure to tell the people there was one coming who was much greater than he was and he would baptize them with the Holy Spirit. John had a few followers and a powerful enemy, Herod the King. Pt.1: John preached repentance of sin and baptism. He forewarned the people of the Lord's coming. Pt. 2: John did not self-promote himself. He was humbled. John knew his place and what God had called him to do. It is best summed up in John's statement "I must decrease, and he will increase. The Prepared is Jesus. He comes to the Jordan River to be baptized and immediately John recognizes Him as the Son of God. Who will take away the sins of the world. After He is baptized, the Holy Spirit in the form of a dove lands on Him and God from heaven gave His approval. Immediately after baptism the Holy Spirit drives Jesus into the wilderness where he fasts and is tempted by Satan. Pt. 3: We may not hear an audible voice of God's approval, but His blessings and peace are examples. Pt. 4: The Holy Spirit will never lead us to a place and abandon us. We are never alone. The presence of God is always there. Pt. 5: Even in the Wilderness, with the wild beast and Satan, God still provides.

Lesson 2: Overcoming Temptation with the Word:

In this lesson we are confronted with a challenge. The challenge is temptation. Temptation comes at us in many ways. Every day of our lives we are facing this challenge. Temptation is sin. We are told to yield not to temptation. Don't give in to it. We have to maintain our focus or we can easily be overwhelmed. Temptation confronted Jesus right after His baptism by John the Baptist. The Spirit led Jesus into the wilderness to be tempted by Satan himself. Temptation strikes when we are vulnerable. Jesus had fasted for 40 days, and 40 nights and His flesh was weak because of hunger. That's when Satan attacked. Temptation attacks the body, soul, and spirit. When the body is weak everything suffers. That was Satan's first attack. Next, he attacked the soul. Satan is persistent. He will never quit. We should never tempt the Lord, our God. Finally, he attacks the spirit. Satan lost each encounter because Jesus used the Word of god each time. The Word of God is powerful. The Word of God is our weapon. (Pt.1): Ephesian 6 states we must utilize the whole armor of God.

God's word is more powerful that anything we can do or say. (Pt. 2): James 4 tells us to Resist the devil and he will flee. God's word is the best defense against Satan. (Pt.3): We are to cast our cares upon Christ and He will strengthen and restore us. God will never abandon us in times of temptation. (Pt.4): We are told to stand against temptation. God will help us to endure and show us a way out. After Satan lost each encounter, he left Jesus for a season. He was not finished. Just because you win a few battles, never think the war is over. We will never be free from temptations. But the Holy Spirit has given us power to overcome.

Lesson 3: Doing the Father's Work: This lesson is all about Jesus doing the will of God. As we saw, Jesus always pleased God in what He said and did. Jesus is in total unity with God through the Holy Trinity. The Trinity in Christian doctrine is that the unity of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit are three persons in one Godhead. This lesson centered around Jesus healing a man on the sabbath and Jesus becomes an enemy of the Jewish leaders. He further causes an uproar when he called God his Father. This is when they began plotting to kill Jesus. The Father and Son works together. Jesus did only what God sent and instructed him to do. There is total unification with God and Jesus. When we become one with Christ, we too become dependent on Him. (Pt. 1): Jesus is totally dependent on God the Father. Likewise, we must recognize our dependence on Jesus. God the Father trust His Son. God gives life and Jesus gives life. (Pt. 2): The things Jesus did and said makes Him worthy of all Honor and Praise. Scripture tells us that God has committed all judgment and authority to Jesus. Many had problems understanding the things Jesus said and what He did. However, as believers we are not tasked to understand but to trust and believe. (Pt. 3): We are told to study to show ourselves approved. Studying God's word will develop and strengthen. We must not rely on our own intellect. Unlike the Jews of Jesus' time we have a deeper knowledge of the trinity and the unity of the three. Jesus is God's Son. They are coequal. God has given all to Jesus and it is to Jesus that we must give an account. (Pt.4): We should never doubt Jesus' power and authority, God has given Him dominion over all creation.

Unit 2: By His Sacrifice:

We are now focusing on the great sacrifices Jesus made on our behalf. This sacrifice included pain, abuse, harassment, humiliation, beating, and ultimately death on the Cross. However, through it all Jesus still pleased God.

Lesson 1: Submitting to the Father's Will: The act of submitting is an act of obedience. Jesus was always obedient to the Will of God. This lesson took place in the Garden of Gethsemane. Jesus takes His disciples with Him. He tells them to stay while He goes to pray. He takes Peter, James and John with him and tells them of His agony and burden. He asked them to watch while He prays. Jesus prays three times each prayer is the same each had more intensity. At the end of each prayer Jesus came back and finds the disciples asleep. Three times Jesus comes back and finds them asleep. Jesus' prayer to God was to take the cup away if there was another way. Nevertheless, let your will be done. After the third prayer, Judas comes with the soldiers and points out Jesus with a kiss. Jesus is fully human, and He is bearing the sins of the entire world. (Pt. 1): We need people in our circle to pray with us and be there to help us. That's why Jesus took the disciples with Him. (Pt.2): In times of trouble and distress, spend some time in prayer. Jesus prayed the same prayer, but each prayer got deeper and more intense. (Pt. 3): We may be willing to do what is asked, but we give in to the desires of the flesh. That's why the disciples fell asleep. (Pt.4): Even our closest friend will turn against us and let us down. Judas called Jesus Master, but still betrayed Him.

In April we will continue with Unit II on the topic: By His Sacrifice. We will discuss the agony of Jesus' Death, His hasty Burial in a borrowed grave, and the events surrounding His Resurrection.

My prayer is for God to continue to bless this ministry as we strive to share the Good News of Jesus Christ our Lord and Savior.

APRIL SHOWERS!

April showers will bring May flowers, but the showers/storms of March have brought a whole new element to our weather. Whether you believe in climate change or not, it's time to prepare for more severe weather than we've been

having. We may need to invest in some stronger shingles, better windows, or $_{\rm S}$ window coverings (shutters) like they have in the gulf states. Planning ahead always saves time and money.

It's tax time. Unless you get an extension, your taxes should be filed/mailed NLT April 18, 2023. Getting my taxes done in a timely manner takes an enormous amount of stress off my shoulders. You should have all your documents together by now. If you will be getting/got a refund, please manage it wisely.

- a. Pay off at least one bill. If it is a major credit card, leave the account open and only use it once per year.
- b. Start your emergency fund. A little goes a long way these days. Just saving \$25 or \$50 per month will add up quickly.
- c. Start that education fund for your child you have been talking about when they were born. They're starting school. Come on.
- d. Start your retirement fund. Time moves so fast. In the blink of an eye, you're at retirement age with no money.
- e. Save for that summer vacation. You won't have to run that balance back up on that credit card.
- f. There's still time to contribute to your 2022 IRA. You have up until April 18, 2023 to add to your IRA unless you have already contributed the maximum.
- g. The maximum amount for IRA contributions has been increased to \$6500. If you haven't maxed out in your 401k, you can contribute now.

It's also time to complete that FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid). Go to Studentaid.gov to create your FSA ID. Collect the following information: Your child's SSN, drivers license number, your federal income tax return for 2021 and any records of untaxed income, and a list of schools they are interested in. If you haven't already, stop by the counselor's office to discuss available grants and scholarships.

Do you ever think about what inheritance you will leave for your children and your children's children? If you're like me, it won't be much. That's why I'm working everyday to make some changes. Just because our parents didn't leave us anything, doesn't relieve us of our responsibility to our children.

Severe pains are not always an accurate indicator, sometimes gas or indigestion can be mistaken for heart attack. If you have any of these symptoms, seek medical attention immediately. 1) pressure, fullness, pain or squeezing in the center of the chest that lasts more than a few minutes and it goes and comes back 3) chest pains that radiates to shoulders, neck, joints or arms 4) chest discomfort along with light headiness, fainting, sweating clamminess, nausea or shortness of breath 5) for women shortness of breath, fatigue, nausea, and upper abdominal pains along with any of the above. Houston Heart Institute has 24 hour on call staff to treat patients with emergency heart problems.







