Faith for the Journey

Grace and peace to you, my beloved Grove Zone family! I pray 2023 is off to a great start for you and your families. May we all experience the Lord doing exceeding abundantly above all we could ever ask or imagine in the days ahead. As we continue our respective individual journeys as well as our collective journey as a church family, I want to challenge all of us to yield to the Lord's work on our faith. Faith can be developed. It can grow stronger if we put in the work. My encouragement to each of us is to invest in our faith so that we please God in every way imaginable.



Regarding faith, there are two things I want you to consider. First, our faith entails what we believe. When I speak of what we believe, I'm not only referring to doctrine, but day-to-day activities. We live in a world with a hurricane-like barrage of misinformation and disinformation. Such information is developing distorted beliefs that can birth an overwhelming amount of anger, hostility, and violence. The insurrection at the nation's capital in January 2021 shows us what people can be driven to do when they believe certain things. We need to be God's holy people who are sober, vigilant, and seeking to have what we believe for our daily lives shaped by the truth.

Before I mention the second thing, I want you to also consider faith as it pertains to what we believe is possible. Faith can suggest that we don't have to settle for some things life brings. Many came to Jesus to receive miracles because they refused to settle for sicknesses and diseases of their own or the illnesses or even deaths of their loved ones. Jesus repeatedly affirmed faith He saw with, "Your faith has made you whole." There are many migrants making a physically grueling, life-threatening, and expensive trek to the United States because they believe a better life is possible here than in their home countries. I am amazed at what people do when they refuse to settle for certain realities and make moves because of what they believe is possible.

The second thing I want you to consider is how faith drives how we behave—our lifestyle. To walk by faith and not by sight suggests we live as those who are governed by Who and what we cannot see. We cannot see God, but we believe He is and that He is a Rewarder of those who diligently seek Him. We cannot see His kingdom, but we believe it exists and that citizenry in His kingdom shapes our lifestyles. As kingdom folk, we love our enemies, we forgive those who have trespassed against us, we share the Gospel, we commit to learning, serving, giving, and connecting. We suffer for the cause of Christ. We have never seen Jesus, but we believe He died for us, was raised from the grave for us, advocates for us, and that He's coming back for us! There's much, much more I can mention here. But suffice it say that our faith in what we cannot see undergirds and drives our behavior/lifestyle. We have a faith that suggests we cannot see God, but we know He sees us! *Can I get a witness?*

I want you to join me in a study of Faith for the Journey. May the Lord grant us greater understanding, wisdom, and maturity in our faith. Let's reach new levels in trusting God for what's possible and being found holy and faithful in His sight! I am trusting God to strengthen us with faith for the journey so that we may enjoy the journey! Be encouraged!

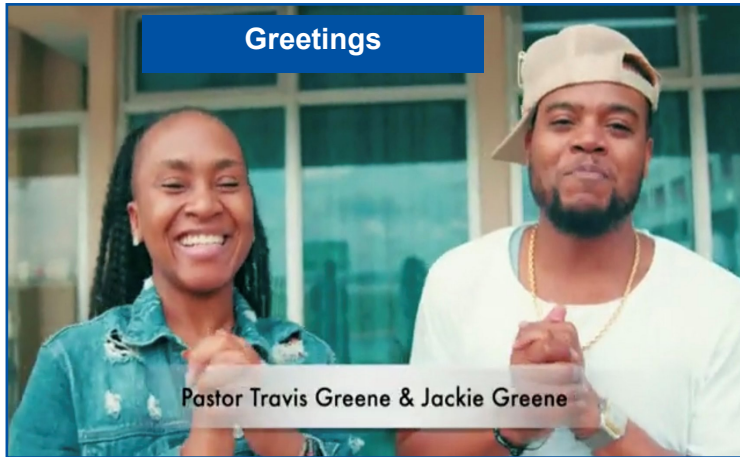

December Recap

Elder Connie Dinkins, Brother Michael White, and Minister Arie Freeman, Jr.

For the month of December, we were in Unit I of the Winter Quarter dealing with the theme: **God's Great Blessings**. The Editorial began with the topic: The Blessing of Trusting God.” We serve a God who can be trusted to do just what He said. Many times, we miss out on our blessings because we are not patient enough to wait on God's perfect timing. Everyone of God's blessings and promises comes with His faithfulness. The greatest of all God's blessings is the gift of His Son, Jesus. During this unit we were in the Old and New Testament, with lessons from Luke and II Samuel. Unit 1 was titled **Blessings of a Saviour**. We got to see how God fulfilled His promise to David and the promise coming of the Messiah. Elder Connie Dinkins and Minister Arie Freeman facilitated the lessons for the month.

Unit 1: Blessings of a Saviour:

In this unit we focused on our relation in society. The Lessons of Unit 1 are **Lesson 1: The Promise of Messiah's Forerunner; Lesson 2: God's Promise to David; Lesson 3: God's Promise of a Saviour, and lastly Lesson 4: The Birth of the Saviour (Christmas)**. All these lessons show how God's blessings are manifested. The forthcoming of John the Baptist, God's covenant with David, the promise of the Saviour from the angel Gabriel, and the climax with the Christmas Day lesson of the birth of Jesus.

Lesson 1: The Promise of Messiah's Forerunner; This week's lesson dealt with John the Baptist. He was to be the son of Zechariah and Elizabeth who were righteous in God's eyes. Elizabeth was barren and they both were old. **(Pt.1) When God has a mission age is no barrier.** Zechariah was performing his priestly duties when an angel appeared unto him near the altar. This was no ordinary angel, this was Gabriel, the chief angel. Zechariah became fearful and rightfully so. But he was soon comforted when the angel told him not to fear, for he was bringing good news. **(Pt.2) God sent His best messenger to deliver the Good News.** Unfortunately, this is not always the case. **(Pt.1) Speaking the truth is essential if justice is to prevail.** Their prayers had been heard and God was getting ready to answer. **(Pt.3) God hears our prayers, and He will answer when He chooses.** The good news was he would become a father, and his barren wife would conceive and bring forth a son. There will be joy and gladness and this child will be great in the sight of God. There were instructions. No strong drink or wine and he will be filled with the Holy Spirit from the womb. **(Pt.4) We must honor God in our commitment to obeying and trusting His word and instructions.** God will hold us accountable for what we do. Zechariah was not fully convinced. This was too much for him to comprehend. **(Pt.5) The blessings of God can overwhelm us.** Scripture tells us God can pour out a blessing that we will not have room for. Because of his skepticism, he would be dumb and not be able to speak until the blessing comes true. **(Pt.6) There are consequences when we do not believe God's word.**

Lesson 2: God's Promise to David: This lesson dealt with David's desire and God's plan. We can have the best intention, but it is God's will that will prevail. David is in his palace surrounded by all the beauty and luxury, and he thinks about the tent that God resides in. It just didn't feel right to David, and he wants to do something about it. How often do we think about those who might be a little less fortunate than us? This was not the case with God, God was content with His dwelling place. **(Pt.1) God was not content with the way His people were behaving, so He sent His Son in human flesh to straighten thing out.** David tells the prophet Nathan his plan and Nathan thinks it's a good plan and tells him to go ahead and do it for God is with you. **(Pt.2) God's**

plan will always outdo our best plans and intentions. God gives Nathan a message for David. I haven't had a permanent dwelling since I brought you out of Egypt. I never complained and I'm not complaining now. I am content. This moveable home is what was required for our journey. Tell David I chose him when he was nothing and I have been with him. He is my chosen leader. **(Pt.3) God has a timetable for what and when He wants to act.** When the time comes, and you are no more, I will raise up your seed and establish his kingdom. He will build my Temple, and I will establish his kingdom forever.

Lesson 3: God's Promise of a Saviour: This lesson was a continuation of lesson 1 from the same chapter of Luke. The Archangel Gabriel had visited Zechariah and was now on his way to Nazareth, a village in Galilee. He had news for the virgin, Mary, who was engaged to be married. The angel greeted her with the salutation "You are highly favored, and the Lord is with you." Mary was confused and troubled because she did not understand the meaning of the salutation. Gabriel explained to her she will conceive and have a son and his name will be Jesus. He will be Great, Son of the Highest, and He will sit on the throne of David. All this was overwhelming for Mary. She said "How can this be. I am a virgin. Gabriel explained, God will do, the Holy Ghost will come upon you, and He will be called the Son of God. He told her about her cousin Elizabeth's pregnancy and that nothing is impossible with God. Mary believed and accepted what was told. **(Pt.1) God used spiritual being to deliver His messages.** Archangels are in the lowest realm of spiritual beings. **(Pt.2) God will do whatever is necessary to calm our fears.** He knows our fears and heart. **(Pt.3) God will not leave out any details.** Gabriel made sure Mary knew what was happening and why. **(Pt.4) If a witness is needed, one will be provided.** Gabriel told Mary about her cousin, Elizabeth's pregnancy. With God, all things are possible.

Lesson 4: The Birth of the Saviour: This is the Christmas Story. The fulfillment of the promise God gave in the Old Testament. Because of the taxing imposed by Caesar, Joseph and Mary had to leave Nazareth and travel to Bethlehem. Joseph was from the House of David. This was in keeping with the prophecy of Micah that even though Bethlehem is a small village, Israel ruler will come from it. It was an approximately 80-mile journey and Mary was close to giving birth. Mary gave birth to the Saviour, and He was laid in a manger in a stable because there were no other vacancies. Shepherds were watching their flock at night and an angel appeared unto them with the news of the Saviour's birth and where they could find Him. A choir of angels, the heavenly hosts, singing and praising God. When the angels left, the shepherds went to see what they had been told. They found Mary and Joseph and the baby. Afterward, they went and told everyone what they had been told and what they had seen. **(Pt.1) The timing of God is never rushed, it is always Right on Time.** **(Pt.2) The taxation imposed by Caesar was an instrument God used to get Mary and Joseph to the intended place.** **(Pt.3) God sends His messengers to spread His good news.** **(pt.4) When you have been given instructions, be obedient and follow them.** The shepherds were going about their business and was provided with an Heavenly Host visit and the Good News of Christ's birth. **(Pt.5) God will do what he said He would do. G-D-D-I-A; God Done Did It Again. #PastorClarke**

In January we will continue the Winter Quarter focusing on Blessing of the Gospel, with the topic: **Faithful to Prophecy.**

My prayer is for God to continue to bless this ministry as we strive to share the Good News of Jesus Christ our Lord and Savior.

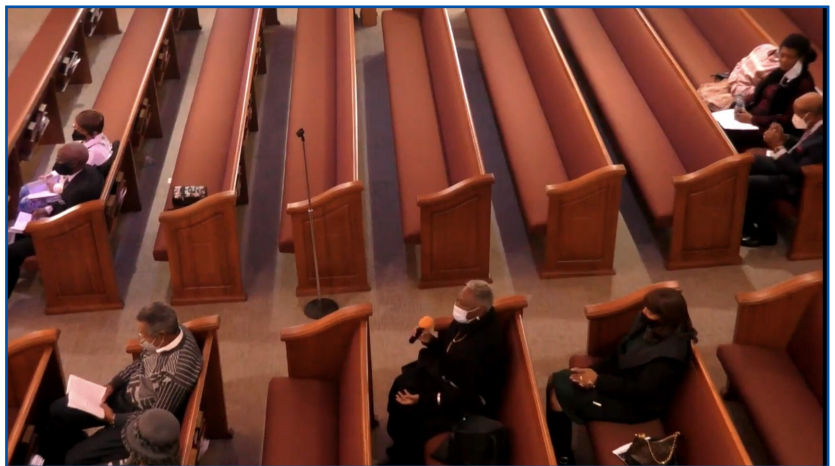

Paul said in Philippians 3:13-14, ***"Brethren, I count not myself to have apprehended, but this one thing I do, forgetting those things which are behind, and reaching for unto those things which are before, I press toward the mark for the prize of the high calling of God in Christ Jesus."***

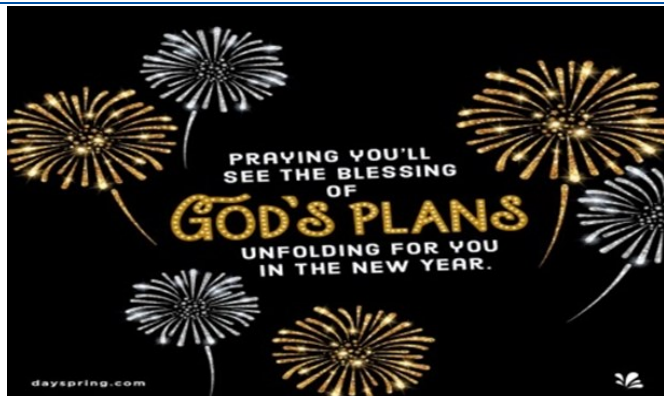

This scripture can be applied to our finances as well as our spiritual life. We made some money mistakes in 2022. Looking at Hebrews 12:1, ***"...let us lay aside every weight, and the sin which doth so easily beset us, and let us run with patience the race that is set before us."*** That debt we added in 2022, let's tackle it this year so we will have a prosperous new year.

- a. **MAKE NO NEW DEBT!**
- b. Apply the **debt stacking** method to all your debt, i.e., pay the smallest balance off first (only paying the minimum on other bills), then roll that payment to the next lowest balance, until all bills are paid off.
- c. If you're like me, you've gotten quite a few offers to transfer balances from high interest cards to **"zero interest rate"** cards for a limited time. These can be helpful if you are disciplined. By **discipline** I mean taking the high interest card out of your wallet, pay the zero-interest card off in the time they state, otherwise, you will end up paying all interest accrued from the first day.
- d. If you have high balances on "high interest" cards, consider refinancing your home to consolidate your debt. Again, you must be **disciplined** so you don't get back into debt or end up in worse shape.
- e. Take that **extra money** you got in your Social Security, Cost of Living, gifts, or other raise, and apply it directly to your debt.
- f. Set up your **budget** and stick to it.

Now let's reduce our other expenses.

- a. Now that the holidays are over, we can go back to our regular grocery shopping. Make a list of items you need and stick to the list. No impulse buying. Frozen vegetables are cheaper than fresh and are just as nutritious. Try the store brands. Buy one item to see if you like it. Shop in bulk. Be sure to compare the unit prices. Also, consider if you will use the items before they go bad or expire. Never shop hungry. The buddy system may not be your friend. I always end up spending more when my husband goes with me.
- b. **SCAM ALERT:** There is a scam about your **Prime Video Account** being locked. They ask you to download some software so they can see what the problem is. They ask if you use "Cashapp or Venmo". This is as far as I got. When the guy asked me about this, I knew it was a scam and hung up. I saw it on the news the next night.

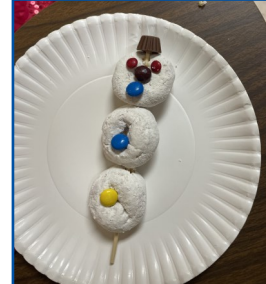
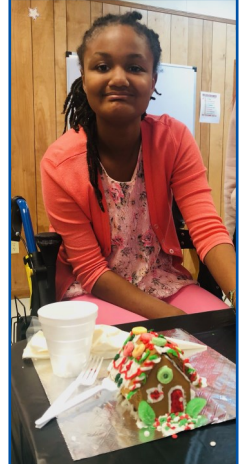
Jeremiah 29:11 "For I know the plans I have for you, declare the Lord. Plan for welfare and not evil, to give you a future and a hope."

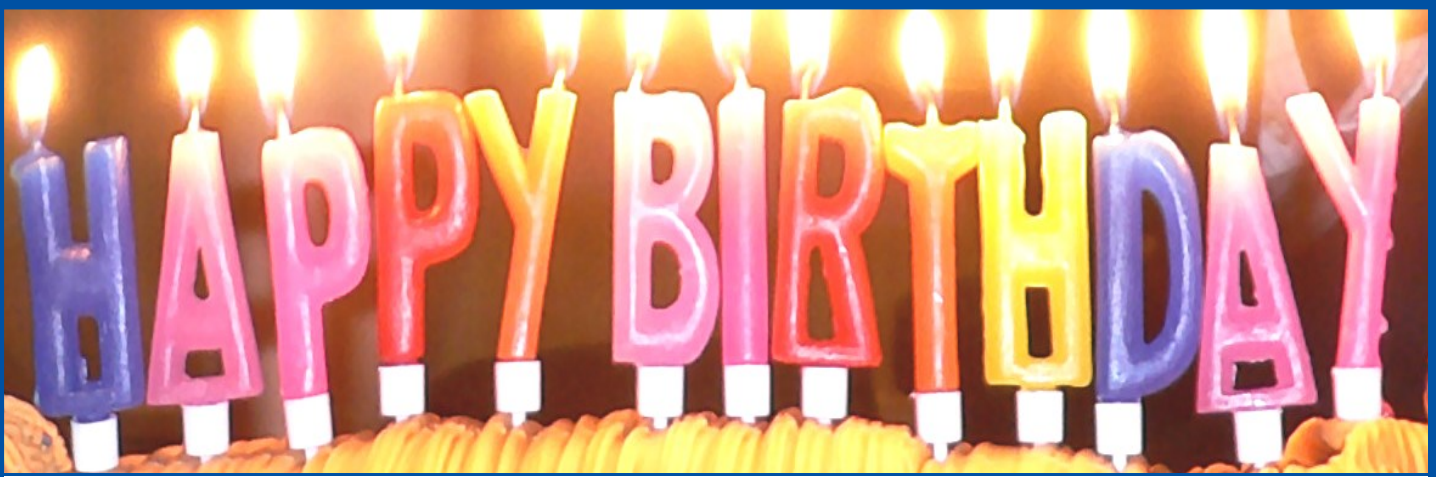


