





April 2023

April consists of several awarenesses we should know about. Here are a few 1) Alcohol Awareness 2) National Autism Awareness, 3) National Child Abuse Prevention 4) Occupational Therapy Month 5) Irritable Bowel Syndrome (IBS) Awareness Month. Did you know that your diet, stress levels, sleep habits and even time spent outdoors can impact your ability to stay healthy? Exercise is crucial, but we know that can be tough with chronic illness. Recent poll surveys showed 58% is chronic pain and fatigue, 48% is common barriers to exercise. Don't let your challenges stop you from staying active. Talk to your doctors about what types of exercises that are best for you and how you can keep your immune system in shape.

Exercise with rheumatoid arthritis (RA) isn't a walk in the park, not even with psoriatic arthritis (PSA). Be sure to share them with your doctors.

~ ADULT SUNDAY SCHOOL ~ APRIL RECAP

Adult Sunday School Teachers

For the month of April, we continued with Unit 2 and the first two lessons of Unit 3 of the Spring Quarter dealing with the theme, Jesus Pleases his Father. During this unit. Unit 2 was titled By His Sacrifice and Unit 3 By His Teachings. We got to see how God used these men to deliver His message. For the month of April Elder Connie Dinkins and Minister Arie Freeman facilitated the lessons.

Unit 2: By His Sacrifice:

This unit focused on the great sacrifice Jesus made on our behalf. His death, burial, and resurrection, (The Easter Story). Unit 2 began with Lesson 5: Crucified for Sinners; Lesson 6: Risen from the Dead; Lesson 7: Proofs of the Resurrection; Unit 3 Lesson 8: The Bread of Life, and lastly Lesson 9: The Light of the World.

Lesson 5: Crucified for Sinners: The focus of this lesson was on the crucifixion of Jesus. Two thieves were crucified along with Jesus. The people passing by mocked and shouted abuse. If you are the Son of God, come down and save yourself. Isaiah 53:3 stated, "He was despised and rejected, a man of sorrows, acquainted with grief". Pt.1: He was treated as a criminal for Jesus had taken on all our sins. He was mocked by the priest and other religious elders. Even one of the thieves ridiculed Jesus. Pt.2: We must not let ridicule and mockery shake our faith. Hold on to Jesus. At noon, darkness soon filled the whole area for three hours. Jesus then shouted with a loud voice "My God, why have you abandoned me". The people were bewildered. They did not know what to think. Pt.3: God cannot bear to look upon sin. Jesus felt abandoned because he had become sin for us. Jesus shouted again and then gave up His spirit. Jesus willingly died for us. The earth shook, graves and tombs opened. Many godly men and women were raised from the dead and was seen by many people. Pt.4: Jesus willingly died so that we might have everlasting life. The curtain in the Temple was ripped giving us access to God. Pt.5: Jesus' death is what gives us free access to God. The Roman officer and the other soldiers witnessed all that happened and remarked, "Truly this man was the Son of God". Gentiles were able to believe what God's chosen people refused to believe.

Lesson 6: Risen from the Dead: The focus of this lesson was on the resurrection of Jesus. The first part of Sunday School was speeches by our youth and a review of the Resurrection story. Mary Magdalene and other women went to the tomb early Sunday morning. They witnessed an empty tomb and was troubled. Mary ran and told Peter and John. They quickly ran to the tomb, John looked inside, Peter went inside. They saw the empty tomb, the burial clothing, and the neatly folded napkin which was on Jesus' head. Afterward, they returned to the room and told the others. Later that evening while the disciples were in the locked room, Jesus appeared unto them. He showed them his hands and where he had been pierced, they were overjoyed that it was Jesus. Pt.1: Those who serve God will witness His greatest wonders. Mary Magdalene faithfully served Jesus. After her conversion she was a loyal follower and was the first to witness the empty tomb. Pt.2: It takes some people a while to believe, while some see and believe. John saw and believed. He believed, for he remembered what Jesus had said. Pt.3: God will bring to our remembrance the thing He said. They departed and went back to the room still somewhat confused about what was happening. They were alone in a locked room.

Pt.4: Jesus is with us and is there to reassure us. The disciples were alone in a locked room, but Jesus appeared unto them in His resurrected fleshly body. Jesus will always offer us His peace. Pt.5: Being in the presence of Jesus is a Joy. Even though the disciples were hiding because of fear of the Jewish leaders, once they saw Jesus all fear was gone, and joy filled their hearts.

Lesson 7: Proofs of the Resurrection: The two men were telling others of how Jesus appeared unto them, Jesus again appeared in the midst. They were frightened thinking they had seen a ghost. To calm their fears, Jesus told them look at my hands and feet, you can touch me. I am not a ghost. Pt.1: Jesus will help us to get over our doubts and fears. They were still in shock but filled with joy and wonder. Jesus explained to them all that was written in the Old Testament has been fulfilled. Jesus told them they are witnesses to His death, burial, and resurrection. Pt.2: We are Jesus' witness and we have a job to do. They were told to stay in the city until the Holy Spirit comes and fills you with power. Jesus led them to Bethany and blessed them. Pt.3: We must be patient and obedient to our calling. As He was blessing them, Jesus was taken up into Heaven. They worshipped Jesus and returned to Jerusalem filled with joy and spent all their time in the Temple praising God. Pt.4: The Holy Spirit is here to lead, guide and direct us. We are never alone.

Unit 3: By His Teachings:

Lesson 8: The Bread of Life: The people who were witnesses to Jesus feeding the 5,000+ was looking for him the next day. When they saw the boats and not Jesus or His disciples, they crossed over to Capernaum looking for Jesus. When they saw Him, they asked how He got there. Jesus understood they were looking to be fed again. He told them to not be too concerned with things that are easily perishable. Be more concerned about things that are eternal. The people were thinking in the natural instead of the spiritual. Many times, we hear things and we don't get the true meaning behind what is being said. We will not ask questions to get a clearer understanding for many reasons. Jesus is the Master Teacher. He will open our understanding so we will be able to understand. Jesus wants us to trust in Him and believe in Him. You cannot have one without the other. Pt.1: Jesus will help us to get over our doubts and fears. It's easy to have doubts. But when you have evidence of proof, then trust and believe. Pt.2: We should not be too concerned with temporal things. Things that are everlasting and eternal are what we should seek. Pt.3: We must seek Jesus for the right reason. We should not be deceptive in our quest for knowledge and understanding. Pt.4: Jesus is the only One who can completely satisfy our needs.

Lesson 9: The Light of the World: The theme for this unit deals with the teachings of Jesus and the Apostle John made it very clear that Jesus was an extraordinary teacher. John's purpose was to reveal that Jesus is the promised Messiah the people were waiting for. Jesus tells the people that He is "The Light of the World." This is the 2nd I Am that Jesus speaks. Just as God told Moses in Exodus "I Am, Jesus is doing the same because He and the Father are One. The world is in darkness which is sin and Jesus is the true light that comes from God. This True Light is Holiness, Goodness, Compassion and Grace. Jesus came to bring us out of the darkness of sin. Even though the Jewish leaders would not accept Jesus' word because He spoke it himself. The Jews were looking for another witness to what Jesus had said. Jesus' witness is God himself. Pt.1: Jesus brings light to our lives. With Jesus as our light, it's hard to stumble and fall. But when you have evidence of proof, then trust and believe. Pt.2: John the Baptist came to bear witness of Jesus as the Light. Sent by God, John witnessed to all that would believe. Pt.3: We cannot know Jesus except through His Son, Jesus. Not only is Jesus the Light, but He is also the only Way to Heaven.

In May we will continue with Unit III with the final four lessons: The Good Shepherd, The Resurrection and the Life; The True Vine, and lastly Jesus Prays for Believers. We will discuss the other I Am's and continue to see how Jesus pleased God with His obedience to God's will.

My prayer is for God to continue to bless this ministry as we strive to share the Good News of Jesus Christ our Lord and Savior.

"IN THE CLOUDS AT CEDINE"

Bible Camp and Retreat Center

Spring City, Tennessee

2023 Men's Retreat, March 24-26

with Brother Leroy Frazier, Men's Leader at Union Grove Missionary Baptist Church.

My Cedine experience shared here is divided into three parts. The first part deals with collecting information about the place, Cedine, and what to expect. I call this "The Comings. The Anticipation." The second part involves brief comments about what took place at Cedine. This is what I call, "In the Clouds on The Mountain Top at Cedine." The final part includes brief reactions headed home with Brother Frazier. This I refer to as "The Goings."

• The Comings. The Anticipation.

- 1. First, I wanted to know about the place, Cedine. Its history, which I found to be intriguing as a place spearheaded by whites to serve Black children in Tennessee beginning in 1946...learning Bible scriptures. Cedine's structure, philosophy, and membership association characterizes its Christian principles. I wanted to witness its geography physical, human, and environmental surroundings on a mountain top with large lake frontage, roadways, walking trails, and other amenities of cabins, food, and adequate space with technology for workshops.
- 2. Second, I wanted to know about the main speaker, Dr. Richard Allen Farmer as a pastor and classical pianist who has spoken, lectured, or performed concerts throughout the world. I was not only interested in Dr. Farmer speaking about the Theme: It's the 4th Quarter, Philippians 3:7-14 but to play the piano.
- 3. Finally, I wanted the retreat to provide useful information that touches my soul to make me a better servant of God.
- In the Clouds on The Mountain Top at Cedine. The Process. This was an experience like no other. Eighty men were singing harmoniously and so loud, I thought the building was about to shake or the roof would take flight. We, Brother Leroy, and I, as part of "The Eighty," were praising the Lord...praying and testifying in openness and heart felt. I was "locked in" in the sessions (and felt so good) when the presenters provided useful information about its time to focus on helping others, being aware of and doing something about your health, and making critical adjustments to your finances for the long view.

In the open sessions, presented by the main presenter, Dr. Farmer, played the piano, using his classical music experience and skills to perform, "What A Friend We Have In Jesus", "Georgia", "I Need You To Hold My Hand", and "He's An On Time God". He graced each song with the musical styles of standard, classical, blues, jazz, and gospel. His musical renditions of these songs were above reproach. We stood in awe as we applauded. I said aloud, "What a musical genius."

Dr. Farmer, addressed the following:

1. **2** Chronicles 26:1-26 about Uzziah, the king: Many times, success fosters pride which often leads to self-exaltation which then results in judgment. What is our outcome - our epitaph? He said, "Live with respect and with the long view".

- 2. **Jeremiah 13:1-11 Jeremiah's Linen Shorts:** Although the people had once been close to God, their pride had made them useless. The same thing can happen to any of us very quickly. Pride will rot our heart until we lose our usefulness for God.
 - "When God speaks, comply to the affirmative!!! Living in compliance with the Lord is a requirement of all of us".
- 3. **Philippians 3:1-14: Being acceptable to God;** Running toward the Goal. "Things that we do, we need to find our strength and place our hope in Christ alone."

Just imagine, as you close your eyes, you are on the mountain top at Cedine. I feel, it is real. I can reach out and touch the clouds. I am riding on the clouds, hovering around Cedine. As I come down to earth, with my new brothers in Christ, we ride horses. I rode on the slowest horse in the group. Giving commands, I said, "trot," "chi", and "whoa". What an exciting ride!!! Second, I went on a hayride along the roadway throughout the Cedine property. The hayride trailer was pulled by a tractor. Finally, I walked along the roadways, trails, and through the brush up and down the side of the mountain talking with the Lord. There were squirrels scrambling up and down the trees. I listened to the birds whistling, leaves and nuts fall to the ground. In my walking, I found myself near the beautiful large lake. There were eight brothers fishing.

Saturday evening, we attended a fish fry, hosted by a large church group of men in the basement of one of the buildings. It seems as if I had known these guys for a long time. While the fish and other items was cooking, some were playing ping pong; others were having spirited conversations. There was singing. The food was blessed. Then, we enjoyed the food, while continuing to converse with each other.

The Goings.

All my expectations of the Cedine retreat were fulfilled so much so that joy and happiness protruded from my body as I was giving my last testimony to "The Eighty" at the last session. I said, "This has been a rewarding experience that I will never ever forget. All of us, with life challenges of family issues, employment with adequate pay, health issues, judicial calamities, and other personal situations, we all...all of us praised the Lord openly with honesty. I love, (pointing to those present), all of you individually and collectively as "The Eighty".

On the last night, when a brother took off his shoes, I asked him, "Do you want me to wash your tired feet?" I wanted to openly demonstrate my kindness to the brother. So, the next morning, I asked the brother, "How are your feet?" He said, "Okay" "Thank you brother Arthur". After more animated ribbing at the front of the room, I said, "All of you, the entire body of "The Eighty", will be going back with me to Warner Robins, Georgia." The final day before our departure, while walking, I reiterated, you will be going with me to Warner Robins. So, do not be frightened, as the bus and the other vehicles take a turn in the air, with the Lord's help you are going to Warner Robins...if not physically, spiritually.

My final comment here is, "Hallelujah!!!! Thank You, Jesus for the opportunity to "Be" "Me" on a weekend with "The Eighty". You, go to Cedine to feel and witness God's unique presence."
